AN ACT

To amend Section one of an act entitled "An act authorizing the employment of stenographers by the district attorneys of certain counties" approved the twenty-seventh day of April Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred nine Pamphlet Laws page two hundred fifty-eight as said section was amended by the Act approved the fourth day of June Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred fifteen Pamphlet Laws page eight hundred seven

1 Section 1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-*
2 *sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly*
3 *met and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same That*
4 Section one of an act entitled "An act authorizing the
5 employment of stenographers by the district attorneys of
6 certain counties" approved the twenty-seventh day of April
7 Anno Domini one thousand nine hundred nine Pamphlet Laws
8 page two hundred fifty-eight which as amended by the Act approved

1 the fourth day of June Anno Domini one thousand nine
2 hundred fifteen Pamphlet Laws page eight hundred seven
3 reads as follows

4 "Section 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of
5 Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in
6 General Assembly met and it is hereby enacted by the
7 authority of the same That from and after the passage
8 of this act the district attorney of any county which
9 shall have less than two hundred and fifty thousand in-
10 habitants and more than ninety thousand inhabitants may
11 employ a stenographer as an assistant in his office at a
12 salary not to exceed the sum of twelve hundred dollars
13 per year to be paid in the same manner that other
14 county officers are paid" be and the same is hereby
15 amended so as to read as follows

16 Section 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of
17 Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in
18 General Assembly met and it is hereby enacted by the
19 authority of the same That from and after the passage
20 of this act the district attorney of any county which
21 shall have less than two hundred and fifty thousand in-
22 habitants and more than ninety thousand inhabitants may
23 employ such number of stenographers as assistants in his
24 office at a salary not to exceed the sum of twelve
25 hundred dollars per year each as the court of said
26 county shall approve to be paid in the same manner as
27 other county officers are paid
