A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act approved the twenty-fourth day of July one thousand nine hundred thirteen (Pamphlet Laws nine hundred seventy-seven) entitled "An act to provide for the personal registration of electors and their enrollment as members of political parties in cities of the first and second classes of this Commonwealth to make such registration a condition of the right to vote in such cities and their said enrollment as members of a political party a condition of the right to vote at primaries in said cities and providing for the payment of witness fees for persons summoned before the commissioners to provide penalties for violations of its provisions and to repeal acts inconsistent herewith"

1 Section 1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-*
2 *sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly*
3 *met and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same That*
4 any person employed in the service of this State or
5 in the service of the Federal Government and required
6 thereby to be absent from the city wherein he resided
7 when entering such employment shall on petition to the
8 proper registration commissioners verified by affidavit and
9 without appearing personally before the commissioners be
10 registered as of the district wherein he shall have re-
11 sided prior to entering such service In such case a
12 residence by street and number shall not be required but
13 the person shall be registered as of the proper district
14 In the case of persons employed by this Commonwealth
15 no such petition shall be considered unless it be accom-
16 panied by a certificate from the Auditor General under
17 the seal of his office setting forth that the proper per-
18 son is actually employed in the service of this Common-
19 wealth and also setting forth the nature of such em-
20 ployment and the time when such person first entered
21 such employment In the case of persons employed by
22 the Federal Government no such petition shall be con-
23 sidered unless it be accompanied by a certificate from
24 the head of the proper department or chief of the proper
25 division or bureau under the seal of his office setting
26 forth that the proper person is actually employed in the
27 service of the United States and also setting forth the
28 nature of such employment and the time when such per-
29 son first entered such employment No such person shall

1 be registered unless he shall produce to the registration
2 commissioners satisfactory proof that he is by payment of
3 taxes and otherwise entitled to registration When any
4 such person so registered shall vote he shall be required
5 by the proper election officers to sign the ballot check
6 list of the proper district

7 Section 2 The petitions required by this act shall be
8 upon blank form which shall be prepared by the proper
9 registration commissioners and shall be by them furnished
10 on written application

11 Section 3 The act approved the twentieth day of
12 May one thousand nine hundred thirteen (Pamphlet Laws
13 two hundred forty-nine) entitled "A further supplement to
14 an act approved the seventeenth day of February one
15 thousand nine hundred six entitled "An act to provide
16 for the personal registration of electors in cities of the
17 first and second classes of this Commonwealth to make
18 such registration a condition of the right to vote in
19 such cities and to provide penalties for violations of its
20 provisions" and all other acts and parts of acts incon-
21 sistent herewith are hereby repealed
