## AN ACT

To amend section thirteen of an act approved the seventh day of June one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (Pamphlet Laws five hundred and seventy-two) entitled "An act to provide for the protection and preservation of game game-quadrupeds and game-birds and song and insectivorous and other wild birds and prescribing penalties for violation of its several provisions"

1 Section 1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-*  
2 *sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly*  
3 *met and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same That*  
4 section thirteen of an act approved the seventh day of  
5 June one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (Pamphlet  
6 Laws five hundred and seventy-two) entitled "An act to  
7 provide for the protection and preservation of game game-  
8 quadrupeds and game-birds and song and insectivorous and  
9 other wild birds and prescribing penalties for violation of  
10 its several provisions" which reads as follows

1 "Section 13 There shall be no hunting for or shoot-  
2 ing at or chasing of game upon the first day of the  
3 week commonly called Sunday Any person violating this sec-  
4 tion shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty of  
5 twenty-five dollars for each offense" is hereby amended to  
6 read as follows

7 Section 13 There shall be no hunting for or shooting  
8 at or chasing of game upon the first day of the week  
9 commonly called Sunday This section shall not prohibit the  
10 owner of any dogs from using such dogs for the chas-  
11 ing of game on Sunday during the open season but  
12 when so using dogs it shall be unlawful for the owner  
13 of such dogs to carry or have in his possession on Sun-  
14 day any gun or fire arm Any person violating this sec-  
15 tion shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty of  
16 twenty-five dollars for each offense
