## AN ACT

Providing for a referendum to determine the will of the electorate in  
regard to horse racing with legal wagering within the State

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
hereby enacts as follows

Section 1 At the municipal election in the year 1961 there shall  
be submitted in the manner provided by the election laws of the Com-  
monwealth a question to determine the will of the electorate of the

1 Commonwealth in regard to horse racing with legal wagering within  
2 the Commonwealth The question shall be in the following form

3 Do you favor horse racing with legal wagering within the  
4 Commonwealth

5 The question shall be printed on separate official ballots in bound  
6 form by the county commissioners of each county A sufficient number  
7 of ballots shall be furnished to the election officers in each election  
8 district of every county so that one ballot may be supplied to each  
9 voter at the election In districts where voting machines are used the  
10 question shall appear on the face of the machine where the machine  
11 is properly equipped for the purpose

12 Section 2 The results of the election shall be tabulated by the  
13 proper election officers of each county and the results thereof certified  
14 to the Secretary of the Commonwealth who shall certify the results  
15 thereof to the General Assembly

16 Section 3 This act shall take effect immediately.
