AN ACT

Fixing maximum days and hours of service for policemen in cities of
the second class A

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows

- 1 Section 1 No policeman employed by a city of the second
- 2 class A shall be required to be on duty for more than nine out
- 3 of any twenty-four consecutive hours nor for more than forty-four
- 4 hours in any calendar week and every such policeman shall be allowed

EXPLANATION—CAPITAL LETTERS indicate new matter added to bill. Matter stricken through is to be omitted from bill. Underlining indicates new matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter stricken from existing law.

1 to have at least forty-eight consecutive hours off duty in every calendar
2 week except in emergency cases for the suppression of riots or tumults
3 or the preservation of the public peace in times of riot conflagration or
4 public celebrations and in such cases council shall provide for the pay-
5 ment of extra compensation or time off at the same rate as paid for
6 regular service The existing salary or compensation of any policeman
7 shall not be diminished because of the reduced number of hours of duty
8 prescribed by this act

9 Section 2 This act shall take effect January 1 1962
