AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9 1929 (P L 177) entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments boards commissions and officers thereof including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools or Teachers Colleges abolishing creating reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments boards and commissions defining the

powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers and of the several administrative departments boards commissions and officers fixing the salaries of the Governor Lieutenant Governor and certain other executive and administrative officers providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments boards and commissions and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments boards and commissions shall be determined" regulating membership and compensation of the State Board of Barber Examiners and imposing duties on the board

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

- 4 Section 462 State Board of Barber Examiners
- 5 (a) The State Board of Barber Examiners shall consists of the
- 6 Superintendent of Public Instruction and five members Each member

1 of the board at the time of his appointment and qualification shall be
2 a citizen of the United States and a resident of the Commonwealth of
3 Pennsylvania shall have been a registered barber under the laws of
4 this Commonwealth and shall have continuously followed the occupa-
5 tion of barbering in the Commonwealth for a period of at least five
6 years next preceding his appointment

7 (b) Not more than two members of any one organization associa-
8 tion or group composed of barbers or persons interested primarily in
9 the welfare and advancement of barbers barber shops or barber schools
10 shall serve on the board at the same time

11 (c) The board shall elect one of its members as chairman and shall
12 elect [a secretary who need not be a member of the board] one of its
13 members as secretary

14 (d) Three members of the board shall constitute a quorum and any
15 action or order of the board shall require the approval of at least three
16 members

17 (e) The secretary shall have such powers and shall perform such
18 duties not contrary to law as the board shall prescribe

19 (f) The members of the board other than the Superintendent of
20 Public Instruction shall receive [fifteen dollars (\$15)] thirty dollars

1 (§30) per diem for each day actually devoted to the work of the board
2 and the secretary shall receive such reasonable compensation as shall
3 be determined by the board with the approval of the Superintendent
4 of Public Instruction

5 Section 2 This act shall take effect immediately.
