AN ACT

Amending the act of March 31 1949 (P L 372) entitled "An act to promote the welfare of the people of the Commonwealth creating The General State Authority as a body corporate and politic with power to construct improve equip furnish and operate projects and to lease the same and to fix fees rentals and charges for the use thereof authorizing and regulating the issuance of bonds for said Authority and providing for the payment of such bonds

and the rights of the holders thereof and to enter into agreements with the Government of the United States or any Federal agency and authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies to grant assign convey or lease to the Authority lands of the Commonwealth and interests therein and to acquire lands therefor granting the right of eminent domain empowering The General State Authority to sell and convey projects and property to the Commonwealth and providing that no debt of the Commonwealth shall be incurred in the exercise of any of the powers granted by this act" empowering the Authority to construct marine terminals and to improve harbors upon navigable waters

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 The first paragraph of section 4 act of March 31 1949
2 (P L 372) known as "The General State Authority Act of one thousand

5 Section 4 Purposes and Powers General The Authority is created
6 for the purpose of constructing improving equipping furnishing main-
7 taining acquiring and operating sewers sewer systems and sewage treat-

1 ment works for State institutions of every kind and character (heretofore
2 or hereafter constructed) public buildings for the use of the Common-
3 wealth an official residence in the City of Harrisburg which shall there-
4 after be used as the official residence of the Governor of the Common-
5 wealth State arsenals armories and military reserves State airports and
6 landing fields State institutions of every kind and character (heretofore
7 or hereafter constructed) additions and improvements to land grant col-
8 leges State teachers' colleges universities and medical colleges receiving
9 State aid school buildings and the furnishings and equipment thereof
10 for the use of the public schools State highways and bridges toll bridges
11 tunnels and traffic circles on State highways swimming pools and lakes
12 on State land low head dams improvements to river embankments de-
13 silting dams impounding basins flood control projects marine terminals
14 improvements to harbors upon navigable waters and the purchase of
15 lands for rehabilitation purposes in connection with State institutions
16 and for use of State teachers' colleges (any and all the foregoing being
17 herein called "projects") Provided however That the purpose and intent
18 of this act being to benefit the people of the Commonwealth by among
19 other things increasing their commerce and prosperity and not to un-
20 necessarily burden or interfere with existing business by the establish-

1 ment of competitive enterprises none of the powers granted hereby
2 (other than for the construction improvement and maintenance of
3 bridges) shall be exercised in the construction improvement mainte-
4 nance extension or operation of any project or projects which in whole or
5 in part shall duplicate or compete with existing enterprises serving sub-
6 stantially the same purposes and the Authority is hereby granted and
7 shall have and may exercise all powers necessary or convenient for the
8 carrying out of the aforesaid purposes including but without limiting the
9 generality of the foregoing the following rights and powers
