**AN ACT**

Requiring the State Treasurer and other State officials to deduct the tax imposed by any first class city upon salaries wages and other compensation paid to officers and employes of the Commonwealth domiciled or performing services within that city and to make a return and remit the tax so deducted to the Revenue Commissioner of such city

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

EXPLANATION—CAPITAL LETTERS indicate new matter added to bill. Matter stricken through is to be omitted from bill. Underscoring indicates new matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter stricken from existing law.

1        Section 1 It shall be the duty of the State Treasurer or other  
2 appropriate State official at the time of payment of the salary wage or  
3 other compensation to any officer or employe of the Commonwealth of  
4 Pennsylvania with the exception of elected officials domiciled or render-  
5 ing services within any first class city to deduct any tax imposed by  
6 such city on the salary wage or other compensation paid by the Com-  
7 monwealth to any officer or employe thereof The State Treasurer or  
8 other appropriate State official shall on or before the last day of April  
9 July October and January of each year beginning with July 1981 make  
10 a return on a form furnished by or obtainable from the Revenue Com-  
11 mission of such city and remit to the Revenue Commissioner the amount  
12 of tax so deducted for the three month period ending on the last day  
13 of the month preceding

14        Section 2 This act shall take effect immediately
