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## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12 1951 (P L 90) entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors alcohol and malt and brewed beverages amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto regulating and restricting the manufacture purchase sale possession consumption importation transportation furnishing holding in bond holding in storage traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the persons engaged or employed therein defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board providing for the estab-

lishment and operation of State liquor stores for the payment of certain license fees to the respective municipalities and townships for the abatement of certain nuisances and in certain cases for search and seizure without warrant proscribing penalties and forfeitures providing for local option and repealing existing laws" authorizing licensed establishments to sell until two o'clock ante-meridian on Sundays

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

- 1 Section 1 Subsection (a) of section 406 act of April 12 1951 (P L.
- 2 90) known as the "Liquor Code" amended January 7 1960 (P L 2106)
- 3 is amended to read
- 4 Section 406 Sales by Liquor Licensees Restrictions (a) Every hotel
- 5 restaurant or club liquor licensee may sell liquor and malt or brewed
- 6 beverages by the glass open bottle or other container and in any mixture
- 7 for consumption only in that part of the hotel or restaurant habitually
- 8 used for the serving of food to guests or patrons and in the case of
- 9 hotels to guests and in the case of clubs to members in their private
- 10 rooms in the hotel or club No club licensee nor its officers servants agents

1 or employes other than one holding a catering license shall sell any  
2 liquor or malt or brewed beverages to any person except a member of  
3 the club No club holding a catering license nor its officers servants agents  
4 or employes shall sell on Sunday to non-members any liquor or malt  
5 or brewed beverages In the case of a restaurant located in a hotel  
6 which is not operated by the owner of a hotel and which is licensed  
7 to sell liquor under this act liquor and malt or brewed beverages may  
8 be sold for consumption in that part of the restaurant habitually used  
9 for the serving of meals to patrons and also to guests in private guests  
10 rooms in the hotel

11 Hotel liquor licensees and restaurant liquor licensees located in  
12 hotels in cities of the first and second class may sell liquor and malt  
13 or brewed beverages only after seven o'clock antemeridian of any  
14 [week] day until two o'clock antemeridian of the following day except  
15 Sunday and may sell liquor and malt or brewed beverages on Sunday  
16 between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and two o'clock ante-  
17 meridian and one o'clock postmeridian and ten o'clock postmeridian  
18 Such Sunday sales shall be made subject to the restrictions imposed by  
19 the act on sales by hotels and restaurants in hotels for sales on week  
20 days as well as this section

1 Hotel and restaurant liquor licensees other than those located in  
2 hotels in cities of the first and second class and public service liquor  
3 licensees their servants agents or employes may sell liquor and malt  
4 or brewed beverages only after seven o'clock antemeridian of any  
5 [week] day and until two o'clock antemeridian of the following day  
6 and shall not sell after two o'clock antemeridian on Sunday No hotel  
7 restaurant and public service liquor licensee shall sell liquor and malt  
8 or brewed beverages after two o'clock antemeridian on any day on which  
9 a general municipal special or primary election is being held until one  
10 hour after the time fixed by law for closing the polls. No club licensee  
11 or its servants agents or employes may sell liquor or malt or brewed  
12 beverages between the hours of three o'clock antemeridian and seven  
13 o'clock antemeridian on any day

14 Any hotel restaurant club or public service liquor licensee may  
15 by given notice to the board advance by one hour the hours herein  
16 prescribed as those during which liquor and malt or brewed beverages  
17 may be sold during such part of the year when daylight saving time  
18 is being observed generally in the municipality in which the place of  
19 business of such licensee is located Any licensee who elects to operate

1 his place of business in accordance with daylight saving time shall post  
 2 a conspicuous notice in his place of business that he is operating in  
 3 accordance with daylight saving time
