AN ACT

Amending the act of April 29 1959 (P L 58) entitled "An act consolidating and revising the Vehicle Code the Tractor Code the Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Act and other acts relating to the ownership possession and use of vehicles and tractors" authorizing the issuance of special registration plates and providing additional fees

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

4 Section 501 Registration Plates to be Furnished by Department

6 (i) Upon application by any owner of a motor vehicle designed
7 for passenger travel except suburban motor vehicles the department may
8 issue a registration plate as prescribed in subsection (a) of this section
9 on which shall be inscribed in lieu of the registration number prescribed
10 by subsection (b) of this section any combination of numbers or letters
11 that the applicant may request so long as the request is for numbers
12 or letters that are in the series being used for such vehicles and the
13 plates do not have to be specially manufactured for such applicant
14 The applicant shall comply with all laws pertaining to registration and
15 licensing of motor vehicles and the application for registration for the
16 year in which new plates are issued shall be accompanied by a fee of ten
17 dollars (\$10.00) in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed
