## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 11 1905 (P L 518) entitled "An act making an appropriation for the erection of a home or school for indigent orphans to be called the Thaddeus Stevens Industrial and Reform School of Pennsylvania in which school provision shall be made for giving instruction in reading writing arithmetic drawing duties of citizenship elementary manual training the elements of farming and other requisite branches" authorizing the instruction of certain additional pupils not residing in the school

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Section 8 act of May 11 1905 (P L 518) entitled "An

9 Section 8 There shall be received into the institution indigent  
10 orphan boys or other deserving boys from the State of Pennsylvania  
11 above the age of fifteen years whose admission may be applied for  
12 under such regulations as the Board of Trustees may adopt In con-  
13 sidering such admission no preference shall be shown on account of  
14 race or color or religion The course of instruction shall be the equi-  
15 valent of a four year public high school course and shall include (1)  
16 vocational education of less than college grade for the purpose of fitting  
17 pupils to pursue effectively a recognized profitable employment and

- 1 (2) such vocational education for pupils not residing in the school and
- 2 for whom facilities for such vocational education are not otherwise
- 3 readily available and (3) evening or other classes providing such in-
- 4 struction for persons seventeen years of age or over who have left
- 5 full-time school
