**AN ACT**

Amending the act of May 29 1956 (P L 1804) entitled "An act providing for the establishment of police pension funds or pension annuities in certain boroughs towns and townships and the regulation and maintenance thereof providing for an actuary continuance of existing funds or transfer thereof to funds herein established prescribing rights of beneficiaries contributions by members providing for expenses of administration continuation of existing authority to provide annuity contracts credit for

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Section 3 act of May 29 1956 (P L 1804) entitled "An

11 Section 3 Each ordinance or resolution establishing a police pension  
12 fund shall prescribe a minimum period of total service not less than an  
13 aggregate of twenty years in the same borough town or township and  
14 shall fix the age of the members of the force at [sixty] fifty-five years

1 after which they may retire from active duty and such members as  
 2 are retired shall be subject to service from time to time as a police  
 3 reserve in cases of riot tumult or preservation of the public peace until  
 4 unfitted for such service when they may be finally discharged by reason  
 5 of age or disability
