**AN ACT**

Amending the act of July 15 1957 (P. L. 901) entitled "An act giving cities of the third class the right and power to adopt one of several plans of optional charters and to exercise the powers and authority of local self-government subject to certain restrictions and limitations providing procedures for such adoption and defining the effect thereof" further regulating the compensation of mayors councilmen treasurers controllers and department heads

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Subsection (c) of section 607 act of July 15 1957 (P L.  
 2 901) known as the "Optional Third Class City Charter Law" is amended  
 3 to read

4 Section 607 \* \* \*

5 (a) The compensation of the mayor councilmen controller treasurer  
 6 and department heads shall be fixed by council [immediately after its  
 7 organization] except as otherwise provided in this section

8 The mayor councilmen controller and treasurer elected to their  
 9 offices in the year prior to the transition year to the mayor-council plan
