AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12 1951 (P L 90) entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors alcohol and malt and brewed beverages amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto regulating and restricting the manufacture purchase sale possession consumption importation transportation furnishing holding in bond holding in storage traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the persons engaged or employed therein defining the powers and duties of

the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board providing for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores for the payment of certain license fees to the respective municipalities and townships for the abatement of certain nuisances and in certain cases for search and seizure without warrant prescribing penalties and forfeitures providing for local option and repealing existing laws" authorizing issuance of liquor licenses in lieu of retail dispenser's licenses to clubs

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

Section 1 Subsection (a) of section 461 act of April 12 1951 (P L 90) known as the "Liquor Code" amended August 11 1959 (P L 670) and December 17 1959 (P L 1932) is amended to read

Section 461 Limiting Number of Retail Licenses To Be Issued In Each Municipality (a) No licenses shall hereafter be granted by the board for the retail sale of malt or brewed beverages or the retail sale of liquor and malt or brewed beverages in excess of one of such licenses of any class for each one thousand five hundred inhabitants in any municipality exclusive of licenses granted to airport restaurants and

1 hotels as defined in this section and clubs but at least one such licenseo
2 may be granted in each municipality except in municipalities where the
3 electors have voted against the granting of any retail licenses Nothing
4 contained in this section shall be construed as denying the right to the
5 board to renew or to transfer existing retail licenses of any class not-
6 withstanding that the number of such licensed places in a municipality
7 shall exceed the limitation hereinbefore prescribed or to deny the right
8 to the board to issue a retail license to a club in lieu of a retail dis-
9 penser's license previously issued to the club but where such number
10 exceeds the limitation prescribed by this section no new license except
11 for hotels and airport restaurants as defined in this section shall be
12 granted so long as said limitation is exceeded
