AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9 1929 (P L 177) entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments boards commissions and officers thereof including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools or Teachers Colleges abolishing creating reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments boards and commissions defining the powers and

duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers and of the several administrative departments boards commissions and officers fixing the salaries of the Governor Lieutenant Governor and certain other executive and administrative officers providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments boards and commissions and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments boards and commissions shall be determined" providing for the medical and surgical care of inmates of State institutions in State-aided hospitals and for reimbursement to the State for the cost thereof

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 The act of April 9 1929 (P L 177) known as "The Ad-
2 ministrative Code of 1929" is amended by adding after section 528
3 thereof a new section to read

4 Section 529 Under such regulations as may be prescribed by the
5 department board or commission having supervisory powers over a

1 State institution any inmate thereof may be transferred to a State-aided
 2 hospital for medical or surgical care for which care the State-aided hos-
 3 pital shall be paid at the standard rates which it charges for the same
 4 care of other persons Whenever the State shall be entitled to reim-
 5 bursement for the maintenance or care of the inmate the amount paid
 6 under this section for his medical or surgical care in a State-aided
 7 hospital shall be included in such reimbursement
