AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9 1929 (P. L. 177) entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments boards commissions and officers thereof including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools or Teachers Colleges abolishing creating reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments boards and commissions defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and ad-

ministrative officers and of the several administrative departments boards commissions and officers fixing the salaries of the Governor Lieutenant Governor and certain other executive and administrative officers providing for the appointment of certain administrative officers and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments boards and commissions and prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments boards and commissions shall be determined" changing the membership of the State Board of Pharmacy and the requirements for a quorum thereof

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Section 413 act of April 9 1929 (P L 177) known as

3 is amended to read
4 Section 413 State Board of Pharmacy The State Board of Pharmacy
5 shall consist of the Superintendent of Public Instruction the Secretary
6 of Health the Secretary of Public Welfare and [five] six persons who

1 shall be appointed for terms of six years from among the most skillful
2 pharmacists in Pennsylvania who are not teachers or instructors in any
3 educational institution teaching pharmacy Each appointee must have
4 been registered as a pharmacist in Pennsylvania at least ten years
5 previous to his appointment and he must be actually engaged in con-
6 ducting a pharmacy One such appointee shall be engaged in conducting
7 a pharmacy in a State-aided hospital

8 [Three] Four members of the board shall constitute a quorum
9 The board shall select from their number a chairman and shall elect a
10 secretary who need not be a member of the board

11 The members of the board other than the Superintendent of Public
12 Instruction the Secretary of Health and the Secretary of Public Wel-
13 fare shall be paid fifteen dollars per diem when actually engaged in the
14 performance of their official duties and the secretary shall receive such
15 reasonable compensation as the board shall determine with the approval
16 of the Superintendent of Public Instruction
