**AN ACT**

Amending the act of July 28 1953 (P L 723) entitled "An act relating to counties of the second class amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto" removing the limitations on appropriations which may be made for agricultural extension work

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

4 Section 2136 Agricultural Extension Work The board of commia-  
5 sioners may make appropriations [not to exceed eighteen thousand  
6 dollars (\$18,000)] in an amount to be determined by the commissioners  
7 annually for agricultural extension work in co-operation with the Penn-  
8 sylvania State University in encouraging improved methods of farm  
9 management and home economics and giving practical instruction and  
10 demonstrations in agriculture for the purpose of improving and develop-  
11 ing the agricultural resources of the county The money so appropriated  
12 shall be expended according to rules and regulations prescribed or ap-  
13 proved by the board of commissioners The board of commissioners may  
14 also where practicable and desirable provide offices in the county court  
15 house for headquarters for such cooperative work
