AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12 1951 (P L 90) entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors alcohol and malt and brewed beverages amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto regulating and restricting the manufacture purchase sale possession consumption importation transportation furnishing holding in bond holding in storage traffic in and use of alcoholic liquors alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the persons engaged or employed therein defining the powers and duties of

the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board providing for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores for the payment of certain license fees to the respective municipalities and townships for the abatement of certain nuisances and in certain cases for search and seizure without warrant prescribing penalties and forfeitures providing for local option and repealing existing laws" authorizing the sale of liquor and malt or brewed beverages on Sunday when New Year's Day occurs on Sunday

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

- 1 Section 1 Subsection (a) of section 406 act of April 12 1951
- 2 (P L 90) known as the "Liquor Code" amended January 7 1960 (P L
- 3 2106) is amended to read
- 4 Section 406 Sales by Liquor Licensees Restrictions (a) Every hotel
- 5 restaurant or club liquor licensee may sell liquor and malt or brewed
- 6 beverages by the glass open bottle or other container and in any mix-
- 7 ture for consumption only in that part of the hotel or restaurant
- 8 habitually used for the serving of food to guests or patrons and in the
- 9 case of hotels to guests and in the case of clubs to members in their
- 10 private rooms in the hotel or club No club licensee nor its officers

1 servants agents or employes other than one holding a catering license
2 shall sell any liquor or malt or brewed beverages to any person except a
3 member of the club No club holding a catering license nor its officers
4 servants agents or employes shall sell on Sunday to nonmembers any
5 liquor or malt or brewed beverages In the case of a restaurant located
6 in a hotel which is not operated by the owner of the hotel and which
7 is licensed to sell liquor under this act liquor and malt or brewed beverages
8 may be sold for consumption in that part of the restaurant habitually
9 used for the serving of meals to patrons and also to guests in
10 private guests rooms in the hotel

11 Hotel liquor licensees and restaurant liquor licensees located in
12 hotels in cities of the first and second class may sell liquor and malt or
13 brewed beverages only after seven o'clock antemeridian of any week
14 day until two o'clock antemeridan of the following day except Sunday
15 and may sell liquor and malt or brewed beverages on Sunday between
16 the hours of one o'clock postmeridian and ten o'clock postmeridian
17 Such Sunday sales shall be made subject to the restrictions imposed by
18 the act on sales by hotels and restaurants in hotels for sales on week
19 days as well as this section

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1 Hotel and restaurant liquor licensees other than those located in
2 hotels in cities of the first and second class and public service liquor
3 licensees their servants agents or employes may sell liquor and malt or
4 brewed beverages only after seven o'clock antemeridian of any week
5 day and until two o'clock antemeridian of the following day and shall
6 not sell on Sunday except when New Year's Day occurs on Sunday in
7 which case such licensees their servants agents or employes may sell
8 liquor and malt or brewed beverages on such Sunday after ten o'clock
9 antemeridian and until three o'clock antemeridian of the following day
10 No hotel restaurant and public service liquor licensee shall sell liquor
11 and malt or brewed beverages after two o'clock antemeridian on any
12 day on which a general municipal special or primary election is being
13 held until one hour after the time fixed by law for closing the polls
14 No club licensee or its servants agents or employes may sell liquor or
15 malt or brewed beverages between the hours of three o'clock ante-
16 meridian and seven o'clock antemeridian on any day
17 Any hotel restaurant club or public service liquor licensee may
18 by given notice to the board advance by one hour the hours herein pre-
19 scribed as those during which liquor and malt or brewed beverages
20 may be sold during such part of the year when daylight saving time

1 is being observed generally in the municipality in which the place of
 2 business of such licensee is located Any licensee who elects to operate
 3 his place of business in accordance with daylight saving time shall post
 4 a conspicuous notice in his place of business that he is operating in
 5 accordance with daylight saving time
