The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Section 10 act of January 14 1952 (P L 1898) known as
2 the "Funeral Director Law" is amended to read

3 Section 10 Expiration of Licenses Renewal All valid funeral di-
4 rectors' licenses granted or renewed under this or any prior act shall ex-
5 pire on the first day of February [following their issuance or renewal]
6 of 1962 and biennially thereafter It shall be the duty of the board on
7 or before the first day of November of each odd numbered year to mail
8 to every licensed funeral director a blank application for renewal of li-
9 cense Renewal may be effected at any time during the month of January
10 [following] of every even numbered year by the filing of such applica-
11 tion with the board together with such renewal fee as may be fixed by
12 the department with the approval of the board The board may at its
13 discretion renew the license of any funeral director who has failed to
14 make application for renewal before the first day of February of any
15 even numbered year
