**AN ACT**

Amending the act of June 19 1931 (P L 589) entitled as amended

“An act to promote the public health and safety by providing for the examination and licensure of those who desire to engage in the occupation of barbering regulating barber shops and barber schools and apprentices and students therein regulating compensation for service rendered conferring certain powers and duties on the Department of Public Instruction and providing penalties” providing for biennial registration and increasing certain fees accordingly.

EXPLANATION—CAPITAL LETTERS indicate new matter added to bill. Matter stricken through is to be omitted from bill. Underscoring indicates new matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter stricken from existing law.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Subsection (d) of section 3 and section 8 act of June 19  
2 1931 (P L 589) entitled as amended "An act to promote the public  
3 health and safety by providing for the examination and licensure of  
4 those who desire to engage in the occupation of barbering regulating  
5 barber shops and barber schools and apprentices and students therein  
6 regulating compensation for service rendered conferring certain powers  
7 and duties on the Department of Public Instruction and providing pen-  
8 alties" amended July 19 1951 (P L 1134) are amended to read

9 Section 3 \* \* \*

10 (d) For any person to be registered as a teacher in a barber school  
11 he must be at least twenty-three years of age a graduate from an ap-  
12 proved high school or its equivalent and have had at least five years'  
13 experience as a registered barber in a registered barber shop in the State  
14 of Pennsylvania The examination for a teacher's certificate shall differ  
15 from the examination for a barber's certificate in that it shall be of a  
16 more exacting nature and require higher standards of knowledge of the  
17 practice and theories of barbering including ability to teach properly  
18 the various practices and theories of barbering physiology hygiene ele-

1 mentary chemistry relating to sterilization and antiseptics massaging  
2 and manipulating the muscles of the face neck scalp hair cutting bobbing  
3 shaving and trimming the beard dyeing the hair and the barber laws  
4 of this State and the rules and regulations adopted by the board The  
5 registration fee for teachers shall be five dollars and the [annual]  
6 biennial renewal fee shall be [~~five~~] ten dollars

7 Section 8 The certificate shall be renewed on or before the thirtieth  
8 day of April [each year] 1962 and biennially thereafter and the holders  
9 of said certificates of registration shall pay to the department the sum  
10 of [two] four dollars or such other sum as may be fixed by the depart-  
11 ment for a renewal card Any holder of a certificate of registration who  
12 shall fail to apply for a renewal of his or her certificate on or before the  
13 thirtieth day of April in [each year] 1962 and biennially thereafter and  
14 who continues the practice of barbering or any of its branches shall on  
15 conviction thereof before any magistrate alderman or justice of the  
16 peace be subject to a fine of not more than ten dollars to be collected  
17 by summary conviction as like fines are collected by law or in case of  
18 nonpayment of the fine to undergo an imprisonment for a period not  
19 exceeding ten days Any such person shall have the right of appeal as  
20 in other cases of summary conviction
