AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10 1949 (P L 30) entitled "An act relating to the public school system including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto" further providing for supplemental payments by the Commonwealth on account of kindergartens

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

4 Section 2502.1 Supplemental Payments The following supple-
5 mental payments shall be made to districts of the third and fourth
6 classes to certain districts of the first class A and of the second class
7 as hereinafter provided and to such other districts as have been ap-
8 proved by the Department of Public Instruction prior to July 1 1954
9 that are the district of residence on account of pupils enrolled in
10 kindergartens elementary schools or high schools operated by joint
11 boards of which the district of residence is a member

12 (a) In the case of joint elementary or high schools operated by
13 school districts of the third and fourth class and to districts of the
14 second class approved by the Department of Public Instruction prior
15 to July 1 1954 five hundred dollars (\$500) per teaching unit multiplied
16 by the subsidiary account reimbursement fraction of the district of
17 residence

18 (b) The following supplemental payments shall be made on account
19 of resident pupils enrolled in schools operated by union or merged
20 school districts of the third and fourth class

1 In the case of a union or merged school district of the third or
2 fourth class within or comprising an approved administrative unit
3 eight hundred dollars (\$800) per teaching unit multiplied by the sub-
4 sidiary account reimbursement fraction

5 (c) In the case of area technical schools and in addition to the
6 supplemental payments provided in (a) and (b) above the following
7 payments shall be made on account of pupils enrolled in area technical
8 schools in which the district of residence participates (1) eight hundred
9 dollars (\$800) per eleven thousand eight hundred eighty class hours
10 membership or more for pupils attending part-time multiplied by the
11 subsidiary account reimbursement fraction or (2) eight hundred dollars
12 (\$800) per teaching unit for pupils attending full-time multiplied by the
13 subsidiary account reimbursement fraction

14 (d) In the case of school districts of the second class which became
15 districts of that class as the result of the merger or the union of two
16 or more districts of the third class or two or more districts of the
17 fourth class or two or more districts of both classes in compliance with
18 provisions of a county plan for the reorganization of school adminis-
19 trative units and attendance areas established by the county board of

1 school directors and approved by the State Council of Education and
2 in the case of merged and union districts which became or which here-
3 after become school districts of the second class by virtue of population
4 growth eight hundred dollars (\$800) per teaching unit multiplied by
5 the district's subsidiary account reimbursement fraction and further in
6 the case of school districts which result from the merger or the union
7 of a district of the first class A or of a district of the second class sub-
8 sequent to the first Monday of July 1961 with one or more districts
9 of the third class or with one or more districts of the fourth class
10 during the first year that supplemental payments are payable eight
11 hundred dollars (\$800) per teaching unit multiplied by twice the total
12 number of teaching units reported by the third and fourth class dis-
13 tricts of such merged or union district for the year immediately pre-
14 ceding the effective date of the merger or the union and by the sub-
15 sidiary account reimbursement fraction of the district of residence for
16 each year thereafter eight hundred dollars (\$800) per teaching unit
17 multiplied by the total number of teaching units reported by such
18 merged or union district less the number of teaching units for which
19 no payment was allowed on the first payment and by the subsidiary
20 account reimbursement fraction of the district of residence

1 (e) In the case of joint schools operating complete programs
2 grades one through twelve or kindergarten through twelve under joint
3 articles of agreement executed subsequent to July 1 1954 to which a
4 school district of the first class A or a school district of the second
5 class is a signatory with one or more districts of the third class or with
6 one or more districts of the fourth class five hundred dollars (\$500)
7 per teaching unit multiplied by the total number of teaching units
8 brought into jointure from the district or districts of the third and
9 fourth classes and by the subsidiary account reimbursement fraction of
10 the first class A or of the second class district of residence

11 No union or merged district which is a member of a joint board
12 or organization shall receive supplemental aid on account of such joint
13 board membership

14 The supplemental payments specified for joint board membership
15 shall be made only for organizations established and operated in ac-
16 cordance with standards and regulations prescribed by the State Council
17 of Education and approved by the Department of Public Instruction

18 Section 2 This act shall take effect immediately
