## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 1 1959 (P L 392) entitled "An act relating to the retirement of State employes amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto" defining "State employes" to include certain civilian employes of the National Guard

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Paragraph (6) of section 102 act of June 1 1959 (P L  
2 392) known as the "State Employes' Retirement Code of 1959" is  
3 amended by adding after subparagraph (e) a new subparagraph to read

4 Section 102 Definitions The following words and phrases as used  
5 in this act unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context  
6 shall have the following meanings

8 (6) "State employe" shall mean a person in one or more of the  
9 following categories

11 (f) Any civilian employe of the Army National Guard and Air  
12 National Guard of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who is employed  
13 pursuant to section 709 of title 32 of the United States Code and paid  
14 from Federal appropriated funds provided the United States Government  
15 shall agree to contribute to the fund from time to time the moneys  
16 required to build up the reserves necessary for the payment of the  
17 State annuities of such employes without any liability on the part of  
18 the Commonwealth to make appropriations for such purposes
