AN ACT

Amending the act of April 29 1959 (P L 58) entitled "An act consoli-
dating and revising the Vehicle Code the Tractor Code the Motor
Vehicle Financial Responsibility Act and other acts relating
to the ownership possession and use of vehicles and tractors" pro-
hibiting the issuance of temporary registration plates to persons
who do not possess a valid operator's card for the current period

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Subsection (d) section 512 act of April 29 1959 (P L 58)
2 known as "The Vehicle Code" is amended to read

3 Section 512 Temporary Registration Plates or Markers

4 * * *

5 (d) No dealer by himself agent servant or employe shall issue assign
6 transfer or deliver temporary registration plates or markers to any one
7 except a bona fide purchaser of a vehicle or motor vehicle owned and
8 sold by him who has a valid operator's card for the current period nor
9 shall temporary registration plates or markers be issued to any one pos-
10 sessed of annual registration plates for a vehicle that has been sold or
11 exchanged nor shall temporary registration plates or markers be loaned
12 or used on any vehicle which the dealer may own nor shall any tem-
13 porary registration plates or markers be issued containing any misstate-
14 ment of fact or any false information upon the face thereof Any dealer
15 who has committed three (3) or more violations of the provisions of this
16 section shall not make application for or issue any temporary registra-
17 tion plates or markers

19 Penalty Any person violating any of the provisions of subsection
20 (b) (c) (d) or (e) of this section shall upon summary conviction before

1 a magistrate be sentenced to pay a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00)
2 and costs of prosecution for the first offense fifty dollars (\$50.00) and
3 costs of prosecution for any subsequent offense and in default of the
4 payment thereof shall undergo imprisonment for not more than ten (10)
5 days and upon conviction of a third offense no temporary registration
6 plates or markers shall thereafter be delivered to such person for the
7 purpose of issuing such plates or markers to any owner nor shall such
8 person thereafter issue any temporary registration plates or markers
9 Any person violating any of the provisions of subsection (g) (h) or (i) of
10 this section or any rule or regulation made by the secretary as herein-
11 before provided shall upon summary conviction before a magistrate
12 be sentenced to pay a fine of ten dollars (\$10.00) and costs of prosecu-
13 tion for the first offense and twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and costs of
14 prosecution for any subsequent offense and in default of the payment
15 thereof shall undergo imprisonment for not more than five (5) days

16 Limitation The provisions of this section are subject to the limitation
17 of actions as set forth in section 1201 of this act
