AN ACT

Requiring the State Treasurer and other State officials to deduct the tax imposed by any political subdivision upon salaries wages and other compensation paid to officers and employes of the Commonwealth domiciled or performing services within that political subdivision and to make a return and remit the tax so deducted to the tax collector of such political subdivision

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 It shall be the duty of the State Treasurer or other ap-
2 propriate State official at the time of payment of the salary wage or
3 other compensation to any officer or employe of the Commonwealth
4 of Pennsylvania domiciled or rendering services within any political
5 subdivision to deduct any tax lawfully imposed by such political sub-
6 division on the salary wage or other compensation paid by the Com-
7 monwealth to any officer or employe thereof The State Treasurer or
8 other appropriate State official shall on or before the last day of April
9 1961 and every three months thereafter make a return on a form fur-
10 nished by or obtainable from the tax collector of such political sub-
11 division showing the amount of tax so deducted for the three month
12 period ending on the last day of the month preceding and include
13 therewith payment of the tax so deducted

14 Section 2 This act shall take effect in thirty days
