AN ACT

Making it unlawful to hereafter establish a junk yard or scrap yard within a certain distance of a State highway requiring that existing junk yards or scrap yards within a certain distance of State highways have fences so that material therein is not visible from the highway and prescribing penalties

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

EXPLANATION—CAPITAL LETTERS indicate new matter added to bill. Matter stricken through is to be omitted from bill. Underscoring indicates new matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter stricken from existing law.

1 Section 1 It shall be unlawful for any person to hereafter establish
2 an open air junk yard or scrap yard including but not limited to
3 automobile junk or grave yards any part of which is located within
4 six hundred feet of the right-of-way of any State highway

5 Section 2 Every person who on the effective date of this act is
6 engaged in the operation or maintenance of a junk yard or scrap yard
7 including but not limited to automobile junk or grave yards any part
8 of which is located within six hundred feet of the right-of-way of any
9 State highway shall erect and thereafter maintain in good repair an
10 opaque fence of substantial construction and of sufficient height so that
11 material in such junk yard or scrap yard is not visible from the State
12 highway

13 Section 3 Any person who violates the provisions of this act shall
14 upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding be sentenced to pay
15 a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100) and costs of prosecution and in
16 default of payment of such fine and costs such person or the responsible
17 officers or employes of a corporation shall undergo imprisonment for
18 thirty days Every day in which a violation occurs shall be considered a
19 separate offense
