AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10 1949 (P L 30) entitled "An act relating to the public school system including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto" limiting the amount by which taxes may be increased in a fiscal year by joint and union districts and providing for the consent of the electorate in certain cases

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Section 672 act of March 10 1949 (P L 30) known as the
2 "Public School Code of 1949" is amended by adding at the end thereof
3 a new subsection to read

4 Section 672 Tax Levy Limitations

5 * * *

6 (e) No union or merged district or joint school district or any mem-
7 ber of a joint school district shall increase the millage levied by it for
8 any fiscal year by more than ten mills except as hereinafter provided
9 If any union or merged district or joint school district or any member
10 of a joint school district desires to increase the millage levied by it for
11 any fiscal year by more than ten mills it shall submit to the electorate
12 of the district the question of whether or not such increase shall be
13 permitted If a majority of those voting do not consent to such increase
14 then ten mills shall constitute the maximum increase which may be levied
15 for any fiscal year The election shall be held as provided by law but
16 may be held as a special election or at the time set for a regular election
