AN ACT

Amending the act of June 24 1939 (P L 872) entitled "An act to consolidate amend and revise the penal laws of the Commonwealth" requiring a receipt containing certain items in the case of an installment sale and imposing a penalty

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

- 1 Section 1 The act of June 24 1939 (P L 872) known as "The Penal
2 Code" is amended by adding after section 699.13 a new section to read

EXPLANATION—CAPITAL LETTERS indicate new matter added to bill. Matter stricken through is to be omitted from bill. Underscoring indicates new matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter stricken from existing law.

1 Section 699.14 Installment Sales Whoever sells any item the pay-
2 ments for which are to be made over a period of time in installments
3 shall issue to such purchaser a receipt which shall clearly show

4 (1) What the full purchase price of the item is

5 (2) What sum was paid at the time of entering into the contract

6 (3) What the actual balance is

7 (4) What the total interest charges are and what they are for
8 each such subsequent installment payment

9 (5) What additional charges if any are made

10 Whoever shall fail to issue such a receipt shall upon conviction
11 in a summary proceeding be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding
12 twenty-five dollars (\$25) and costs of prosecution for the first offense
13 and for any subsequent offense shall be sentenced in a summary pro-
14 ceeding to pay a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100) and
15 costs of prosecution and upon failure to pay any such fine or costs of
16 prosecution shall be sentenced to undergo imprisonment for not more
17 than thirty (30) days
