AN ACT

Making an appropriation to the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum

Commission for the purpose of purchasing museum material

WHEREAS The impressive collections of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission have a number of serious gaps particularly with respect to examples of Pennsylvania's leadership in fine arts furniture making firearms making and

WHEREAS The very popular natural history exhibits are rapidly deteriorating with age and need to be replaced with specimens obtained under more scientific conditions and

EXPLANATION—CAPITAL LETTERS indicate new matter added to bill. Matter stricken through is to be omitted from bill. Underscoring indicates new matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter stricken from existing law.

WHEREAS More representative anthropological archaeological and ethnological collections would add greatly to the interpretation of Pennsylvania's original Indian inhabitants therefore

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

- 1 Section 1 The sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or as much
- 2 thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to the Pennsylvania
- 3 Historical and Museum Commission for the purchase of museum ma-
- 4 terials and in particular specimens of fine arts furniture firearms and
- 5 other handicrafts which illustrate Pennsylvania's leadership in these
- 6 fields as well as natural history specimens and representative anthro-
- 7 pological archaeological and ethnological collections and for the re-
- 8 pair and improvement of existing exhibits and for the design and installa-
- 9 tion of new exhibits and for other incidental expenses
