AN ACT

Amending the act of May 4 1927 (P L 519) entitled "An act concerning
boroughs and revising amending and consolidating the law relat-
ing to boroughs" authorizing disturbing the peace to be defined
and penalized and providing for disposition of such penalties

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania here-
by enacts as follows

1 Section 1 Clause ~~LV~~ of section SECTION 1202 act of May 4 1927
2 (P L 519) known as "The Borough Code" reenacted and amended July
3 10 1947 (P L 1621) is amended BY ADDING AFTER CLAUSE LV
4 A NEW CLAUSE to read

5 Section 1202 Specific Powers The powers of the borough shall be
6 vested in the corporate officers They shall have power

8 ~~LV~~ [~~Disorderly Conduct~~] Disturbing the Peace Ordinances To
9 adopt ordinances defining [disorderly conduct] disturbing the peace
10 within the limits of the borough and to provide in such ordinances for
11 the imposition of penalties not exceeding in amount the sum of ten
12 (\$10.00) dollars for the violation thereof [Notwithstanding] notwith-
13 standing like statutes pertaining to the same or similar offenses All penal-
14 ties imposed for the violation of such ordinances shall be paid to the bor-
15 ough treasurer for the use of the borough

16 CLAUSE LV.I DISTURBING THE PEACE ORDINANCES
17 TO ADOPT ORDINANCES DEFINING DISTURBING THE
18 PEACE WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE BOROUGH AND TO
19 PROVIDE IN SUCH ORDINANCES FOR THE IMPOSITION OF
20 PENALTIES NOT EXCEEDING IN AMOUNT THE SUM OF TEN

1 DOLLARS (\$10.00) FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF NOTWITH-
 2 STANDING LIKE STATUTES PERTAINING TO THE SAME OR
 3 SIMILAR OFFENSES ALL PENALTIES IMPOSED FOR THE
 4 VIOLATION OF SUCH ORDINANCES SHALL BE PAID TO THE
 5 BOROUGH TREASURER FOR THE USE OF THE BOROUGH
