AN ACT

Amending the act of June 23 1931 (P L 932) entitled "An act relating to cities of the third class and amending revising and consolidating the law relating thereto" authorizing the acquisition of land outside the limits of any city for the use of the National Guard of Pennsylvania and authorizing such lands to be annexed to cities

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

5 by this act the council of each city shall have power by ordinance

7 38 Lands for Armory Purposes To acquire by purchase or by gift
8 or by the right of eminent domain any land for the use of the National
9 Guard of Pennsylvania and to convey such lands so acquired to the
10 Commonwealth in order to assist the Armory Board in the erection of
11 armories The power conferred by this clause shall not be exercised to
12 take any church property grave-yard or cemetery Lands within three
13 miles outside the limits of the city may be acquired in like manner for
14 the use of the National Guard of Pennsylvania and such lands may be
15 annexed to the city in the manner provided by this act for the annexa-
16 tion of territory to a city
