AN ACT

Amending the act of April 29 1959 (P L 58) entitled "An act consolidating and revising the Vehicle Code the Tractor Code the Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Act and other acts relating to the ownership possession and use of vehicles and tractors" permitting motor vehicles owned and used by certain persons engaged in collecting news to be equipped with a warning light

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

6 (e) Any motor vehicle owned by any ~~person~~ CORPORATION en-
7 gaged EXCLUSIVELY ON A FULL-TIME DAILY BASIS in the
8 business of collecting and disseminating news through any news media
9 may be equipped with not more than one (1) flashing amber warning
10 light to be approved by the secretary Such light shall be in use and
11 operation only when the motor vehicle is being used by ~~such person or~~
12 ~~his employe~~ AN EMPLOYE OF SUCH A CORPORATION, in the
13 pursuit of his regular employment in covering news emergencies NO
14 MOTOR VEHICLE SHALL BE USED FOR THIS PURPOSE UN-
15 LESS A CERTIFICATE THEREFOR HAS BEEN ISSUED BY THE
16 SECRETARY OF REVENUE
