AN ACT

Amending the act of July 11 1957 (P L 783) entitled "An act making
it unlawful for any corporation to carry on any business under
an assumed or fictitious name style or designation other than
its proper corporate name unless an application is filed with
the Secretary of the Commonwealth and the prothonotary pro-
viding for the amendment of such application fixing the fees of
the Secretary of the Commonwealth and the prothonotary pro-
viding penalties and providing for the cancellation of such applica-

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enact as follows

1 Section 1 The act of July 11 1957 (P L 783) known as the "Fic-
2 titious Corporate Name Act" is amended by adding after section 5 a
3 new section to read

4 Section 5.1 Prohibited Names No fictitious name shall be registered
5 by the Secretary of the Commonwealth if it contains the word "hospital"
6 "clinic" "sanitarium" "nursing home" or "convalescent home" or any
7 other word implying that the business of treating the sick or injured is
8 to be conducted in any of its forms unless the use of such name shall
9 have been first approved by the Department of Public Welfare BUT
10 THIS PROVISION SHALL NOT APPLY TO A CORPORATE
11 NAME WHICH PLAINLY REVEALS THAT IT APPLIES TO A
12 VETERINARY OR ANIMAL HOSPITAL
