AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10 1949 (P L 30) entitled "An act relating to the public school system including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools amending revising consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto" prescribing payments to be made by foreign students at State Colleges

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

- 1 Section 1 The first two paragraphs of section 2008 act of March 10
- 2 1949 (P L 30) known as the "Public School Code of 1949" amended

2 Section 2008 Board and Tuition The cost of boarding and tuition
3 shall be fixed by the trustees of the several State Colleges with the
4 approval of the Superintendent of Public Instruction No difference in
5 the charge for board and tuition shall be made in favor of any students
6 pursuing similar studies except as hereinafter provided

7 The tuition of all students at the State Colleges who are residents
8 of Pennsylvania and who meet such requirements as the board of presi-
9 dents of the State Colleges may prescribe and who sign an agreement
10 to teach in the public schools of this Commonwealth for not less than
11 two years and who are pursuing therein regular courses for the prepara-
12 tion of teachers shall be paid by the Commonwealth Sufficient appro-
13 priations shall be made for this purpose In addition to such appropria-
14 tions the board of trustees may fix and charge such fees as may be
15 necessary for the proper operation of the college and may refund from
16 their respective advancement funds any advance registration deposits
17 paid by prospective students who are unable to enter college Any
18 student being a domiciliary of a country other than the United States
19 of America approved as hereinafter provided for admission to any of
20 the several State Colleges to pursue a course of study shall not be

1 required to pay any fees or charges fixed by the trustees other than
 2 tuition and boarding LODGING and boarding costs Sufficient appropri-
 3 ations shall be made for this purpose The admission of students being
 4 domiciliaries of countries other than the United States of America to the
 5 several State Colleges shall be determined in accordance with rules and
 6 regulations to be adopted and promulgated by the Board of Presidents
 7 with the approval of the Superintendent of Public Instruction
