AN ACT

To authorize the president and directors of the Bank of Pennsylvania to reduce the capital of said bank.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the directors of the Bank of Pennsylvania be, and they are hereby authorized to reduce the capital of the said Bank of Pennsylvania, from two million five hundred thousand dollars, to one million five hundred and sixty-two thousand five hundred dollars; and to reduce the par value of said stock, from four hundred dollars, to two hundred and fifty dollars per share: *Provided, That* said reduction shall not take place until authorized by a meeting of the stockholders of said bank, to be convened by a public notice, signed by the president or cashier of said bank, and published at least once a week, for at least twenty days previous to such meeting, in at least one newspaper printed in the city of Philadelphia, one newspaper printed in the city of Lancaster, one newspaper printed in the borough of Easton, one newspaper printed in the borough of Reading, and one newspaper printed in the borough of Harrisburg.
