AN ACT

Fixing the minimum salaries of county and assistant county superintendents for the terms which will begin on the first Monday of July, one thousand nine hundred thirty-four; providing for the payment of such minimum salaries by the Commonwealth; restricting the number of assistant county superintendents; and superseding any inconsistent acts and parts of acts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, as follows:

Public schools

County and assistant county superintendents.

Section 1. Minimum Salaries of County Superintendents.—The minimum salaries of all county superintendents for their terms which shall begin on the first Monday of July, one thousand nine hundred thirty-four, shall be the following: County superintendents of counties having a population of less than twenty thousand (20,000), minimum annual salary, two thousand seven hundred dollars (\$2,700); county superintendents of counties having a population of twenty thousand (20,000) and more, but less than forty-five thousand (45,000), minimum annual salary, three thousand one hundred and fifty dollars (\$3,150); county superintendents of counties having a population of forty-five thousand and more, but less than one hundred and fifty thousand (150,000), minimum annual salary, three thousand six hundred dollars (\$3,600); county superintendents of counties having a population of one hundred and fifty thousand, or more, minimum annual salary, four thousand fifty dollars (\$4,050).

Section 2. Minimum Salaries of Assistant County Superintendents.—The minimum salaries of all assistant county superintendents for their terms which shall begin on the first Monday of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, shall be two thousand seven hundred dollars (\$2,700).

Section 3. Number of Assistant County Superintendents.—Every county superintendent having more than one hundred and fifty (150), and not more than five hundred and fifty (550) teachers, under his supervision shall have one assistant county superintendent. Every county superintendent having more than five hundred and fifty (550), but not more than one thousand and fifty (1050) teachers, under his supervision shall have two assistant county superintendents. Every county superintendent having more than one thousand and fifty (1050) teachers under his supervision shall have one additional assistant county superintendent for each additional five hundred teachers, or fraction thereof, but no county superintendent shall have more than five assistants. The assistant superintendents in office at the time

this act takes effect shall continue in office until the expiration of their respective terms.

Section 4. Payment of Salaries.—The Commonwealth shall pay the minimum salaries herein provided for county and assistant county superintendents for their terms which shall begin on the first Monday of July, one thousand nine hundred thirty-four, from appropriations for such purposes.

Section 5. Effective Date.—This act shall become effective immediately upon its passage by the General Assembly and its approval by the Governor.

Section 6. Inconsistent Provisions.—All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby superseded for the period during which this act shall be in effect.

AN ACT

Authorizing and empowering school districts of the first class, for a limited period, to furnish food, including milk, to undernourished and poor school children in their districts.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the directors of the school districts of the first class be, and they are hereby, authorized and empowered to furnish food, including milk, to the undernourished and poor school children attending the schools within their several districts, at the expense of the school district, for a period of two years from the effective date of this act.

School districts of first class.

Directors to furnish food to undernourished children.

Section 2. This act shall be effective as soon as approved by the Governor.

AN ACT

To amend section two hundred and twelve of the act, approved the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five (Pamphlet Laws, seven hundred sixty-two), entitled "An act concerning poor relief and the creation and government of poor districts and the administration of the same in all counties of the Commonwealth, except in counties of the first and second class; and revising, amending, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," by requiring poor districts to pay premiums on treasurers' bonds, and providing for depositories for funds of poor districts coterminus with counties of the third class.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That section two hundred and twelve of the act, approved the fourteenth day
