

The act approved the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-one (seven Smith's Laws, page four hundred twenty-nine; Pamphlet Laws, one hundred and fifty-two), entitled "An act relating to proceedings in the action of account render."

The act approved the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one (Pamphlet Laws, four hundred and ninety-two), entitled "An act concerning the action of account render."

Section eighteen of the act approved the thirteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and forty (Pamphlet Laws one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, page one) entitled "An act relating to Orphans' Courts, and for other purposes."

All other acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed. General repeal.

AN ACT

To abolish the action of dower, and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts relating thereto.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the action of dower is hereby abolished.

Action of dower abolished.

Section 2. The provisions of this act shall not apply to actions for the recovery of dower where the right thereto has vested before the date of the approval of this act, but such actions may be instituted and completed under the laws in force before such date and for that purpose such laws are saved.

Actions where right has vested.

Section 3. The jurisdiction of courts of equity in suits for the recovery of dower shall remain as heretofore.

Equity jurisdiction.

Section 4. The following acts and parts of acts of Assembly are hereby repealed as respectively indicated:

Repeals.

Section seventy-nine of the act approved the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six (Pamphlet Laws, five hundred and sixty-eight), entitled "An act relating to the commencement of actions," so far as relates to the actions of dower.

Section one of the act approved the twentieth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four (Pamphlet Laws, eighty-nine), entitled "An act relative to suits in dower and partition," so far as relates to suits and proceedings at law for the recovery of dower.

The act approved the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five (Pamphlet Laws, three hundred forty-five), entitled "An act in relation to the action of dower," absolutely.

Section one of the act approved the twentieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine (Pamphlet Laws, seventy-six), entitled "An act to allow writs of estrepement to issue to stay waste pending writs of error in partition and other real actions," so far as relates to real actions in dower.

Section one of the act approved the eleventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one (Pamphlet Laws, six hundred sixty-three), entitled "An act to regulate and establish the fees to be charged by sheriffs in this Commonwealth, and to provide for the taxation and collection of the same," so far as relates to writs of dower.

Section one of the act approved the twentieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven (Pamphlet Laws, one thousand seventy-two), entitled "An act to regulate and establish the fees to be charged by sheriffs in counties having a population of less than one hundred and thirty thousand, in this Commonwealth, and to provide for the taxation and collection of the same," so far as relates to writs of dower.

Section one of the act approved the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen (Pamphlet Laws, fifty-four), entitled "An act to establish and regulate the fees to be charged and collected by sheriffs in counties of this Commonwealth having a population of not less than three hundred thousand nor more than one million five hundred thousand inhabitants, as computed by the last preceding United States census; the time and manner in which said fees shall be paid, the publication and posting of said fees, the delivery of an itemized receipt for official fees and legal costs received; and repealing all laws, general, special, or local, or any parts thereof, that are or may be inconsistent therewith," so far as relates to writs of dower.

General repeal.

All other acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

To abolish the action of detinue.

Action of detinue abolished.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the action of detinue is hereby abolished.
