SB 82

Making an appropriation to the Legislative Data Processing Committee for completion of certain new projects already undertaken by the Legislative Data Processing Center for the General Assembly.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$180,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary is hereby specifically appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1968 and ending June 30, 1969 to the Legislative Data Processing Committee to be paid on warrants of the Auditor General in favor of the chairman of said committee on the presentation of his requisition for the same, for the completion by the Legislative Data Processing Center of the following new projects already begun in a manner to provide uninterrupted service to the 1969-1970 General Assembly: retention of leased equipment to aid modernization and speedup of printing process; further design and implementation of bill preparation application; continuation of statute and Constitution conversion, making same available for research from data bank.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

HB 1191

Amending the act of June 27, 1968 (Appropriation Act No. 72A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1968 to June 30, 1969, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1968," further providing for certain appropriations to the Judicial Department.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2, act of June 27, 1968 (Appropriation Act No. 72A), known as "The General Appropriation Act of 1968," is amended to read:

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1968, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1968.

A SUPPLEMENT

SB 855

To the act of June 27, 1968 (Appropriation Act No. 72-A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1968 to June 30, 1969, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1968," providing for a deficiency in the appropriation to the Department of Public Welfare made by the act for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969.

Section 1. The following sum, or as much thereof as may be necessary for a deficiency in an appropriation to the Department of Public Welfare is hereby specifically appropriated as follows:

To the Department of Public Welfare

For assistance payments and county administration of the public assistance programs \$7,000,000

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 696

Making an appropriation to the Judicial Department for the payment of salaries to the judges of the Municipal Court and the Traffic Court of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and to the judges of the courts of common pleas.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one hundred thirty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$137,500), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated for the fiscal year July 1, 1968 to June 30, 1969 for the payment of salaries to the judges of the Municipal Court of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Section 2. The sum of thirty-eight thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$38,750), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated for the fiscal year July 1, 1968 to June 30, 1969 for the payment of salaries to the judges of the Traffic Court of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Section 3. The sum of two hundred eleven thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$211,750), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated for the fiscal year July 1, 1968 to June 30, 1969 for the payment of salaries to the judges of the courts of common pleas.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

HB 1335

Making an appropriation to the State Treasurer for the purpose of paying salaries and wages of State officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses in the interim between June 30, 1969 and July 31, 1969 or such time as the funds provided by the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts become available.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of sixty million dollars (\$60,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the State Treasurer of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the purpose of paying the salaries and wages of the officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the interim between June 30, 1969 and July 31, 1969 or such time as moneys appropriated by the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts of 1969 may become available for such purposes; and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969.

Section 2. Payments out of the appropriation of this act shall be made by the State Treasurer upon requisitions by the several departments, boards, commissions or officers in the same manner as payments are ordinarily made.

Section 3. All amounts paid by the State Treasurer in accordance with this act shall be charged against the appropriations made for the salaries and wages of the officers and employes and other ordinary and general expenses of the State government in the General Appropriation Act and other appropriation acts of 1969.

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

No. 6-A

AN ACT

HB 1336

Making appropriations to the Department of Public Welfare and providing for certain allocations therefrom for the purpose of carrying out the Public Assistance Law for the year beginning July 1, 1969 and for the payment of assistance and expenses accrued or incurred prior to and remaining unpaid on June 30, 1969 and further providing for medical assistance.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of seventy-five million dollars (\$75,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Public Welfare for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1969 and for the payment of assistance and administrative expenses incurred prior to and remaining unpaid June 30, 1969, as provided in the acts of June 24, 1937 (P. L. 2017, 2045 and 2051), April 23, 1941 (P. L. 20), May 10, 1951 (P. L. 279), July 13, 1953 (P. L. 431), August 9, 1955 (P. L. 323), the Public Welfare Code, The Fiscal Code, The Penal Code and the Public School Code of 1949. In addition to this amount, all moneys received from the Federal Government, or from any other source as contributions for this program, shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to this appropriation. The Department of Public Welfare shall allocate funds from time to time for administrative expenses of the several county boards of assistance, for such administrative expenses incurred by the department which are chargeable to such boards and for the payment of attorney's fees and court costs necessary for the proper conduct of the public assistance programs: Provided, That any rule or regulation adopted by the Secretary of Public Welfare during the fiscal year 1969-70 which adds to the cost of any public assistance program shall only be effective from and after the date upon which it is approved as to availability of funds by the Governor.

Section 2. The amounts paid for medical assistance payments, shall be based on the same income limits established and employed by the department in determining eligibility for medical assistance payments or services during the fiscal year 1968-69.

Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 797

Amending the act of July 2, 1968 (Act No. 92-A), entitled "An act making appropriations to the Department of Health to carry out its powers and duties pursuant to the provisions of the act of January 24, 1966 (P. L. 1535), known as the 'Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act,' " by reducing the appropriation for grants for official plans.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2, act of July 2, 1968 (Act No. 92-A), entitled "An act making appropriations to the Department of Health to carry out its powers and duties pursuant to the provisions of the act of January 24, 1966 (P. L. 1535), known as the 'Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act,' " is amended to read:

Section 2. The sum of [**five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000),**] *four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000)*, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Health for grants to counties, municipalities and authorities to assist them in preparing official plans for sewerage systems, as required by the act of January 24, 1966 (P. L. 1535), and in accordance with section 6 thereof.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

SB 798

Making an appropriation to the Department of Health to carry out its powers and duties pursuant to the provisions of the act of July 31, 1968 (Act No. 241), known as the "Pennsylvania Solid Waste Management Act."

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Health for grants to counties, municipalities and authorities to assist them in preparing official plans for solid waste disposal systems as required by the act of July 31, 1968 (Act No. 241), and in accordance with section 5 of subsection (a) of section 12.

Section 2. Any of the amounts herein appropriated as are unexpended and unencumbered as of June 30, 1969, shall lapse.

Section 3. This act shall take effect January 1, 1969.

No. 9-A

AN ACT

SB 865

Making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs from restricted revenue in the Motor License Fund for the use of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of two million fifty-one thousand dollars (\$2,051,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account for aviation fuel taxes in the Motor License Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970, for the proper conduct of the work of the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission, including payment of expenses of the commission and salaries, wages or other compensation of an executive director and other employes; for the payment of general expenses, supplies, printing, and equipment; for the development and maintenance of State airports, and the maintenance and repair of landing fields, intermediate landing fields, land field equipment, beacon sites, other navigation facilities, and the encouragement and development of civil aeronautics.

Section 2. In addition to the sum herein appropriated, all moneys received from the operations at the State airports, including but not limited to rentals, concessions, and landing fees, shall be paid into the Motor License Fund and credited to this appropriation.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.

AN ACT

SB 861

Making an appropriation out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Revenue for the use of the Hazardous Substances Transportation Board in regulating the transportation of hazardous substances on highway and toll roads, including the Pennsylvania Turnpike.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of eighty-eight thousand dollars (\$88,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Revenue for the Hazardous Substances Transportation Board for the fiscal year July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970, for the purpose of regulating the transportation of hazardous substances on highways and toll roads, including the Pennsylvania Turnpike, and for carrying out the purposes of the act of November 9, 1965 (P. L. 657), known as the "Hazardous Substances Transportation Act."

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.

AN ACT

SB 871

Making an appropriation out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Public Instruction to promote highway safety education.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of nineteen thousand dollars (\$19,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Motor License Fund to the Department of Public Instruction for the fiscal year July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970, for the purpose of promoting highway safety education through the schools in this Commonwealth.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.

APPROVED—The 30th day of July, A. D. 1969.

HB 1365

To provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as "The General Appropriation Act of 1969."

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1969, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969.

Promotion and holding of annual local, regional and State 4-H dairy clubs and Future Farmers of America dairy shows: Provided, That the department may make allocations of this

appropriation as it deems appropriate to an association whose purposes are in accord with the purposes and intent of this appropriation, the funds so allocated to be used for the development and operation of Junior Dairy Shows: And, further provided, That the funds allocated by the department shall only be used for the specific items approved by the department in advance..... 15,000

Payment of reimbursement to legally constituted law enforcement agencies for kennel construction..... 15,000

To the Department of Banking

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Securities Commission 229,000

To the State Council of Civil Defense

Section 3. This act is not intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal any provision of any act enacted at this or any prior session of the General Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the ordering of printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making payments from the State Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any administrative department, board or commission.

Section 4. No appropriation made by this act to any department, board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be available unless and until such department, board, commission or agency

shall have complied with sections 604, 605 and 606 of The Administrative Code of 1929.

Section 5. The term "employees" as used in this act shall include all directors, superintendents, bureau or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists, engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries, auditors, inspectors, examiners, statisticians, marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers, and other assistants in any department, board or commission.

Section 6. The term "expenses" and "maintenance" shall include all printing, binding and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies, traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephone and telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and notices, fuel, light, heat, power and water, repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of liability insurance, premiums on medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on employe group life insurance, and employe and retired employe group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth share of social security taxes for State employes, the purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of Property and Supplies of mileage charges for the use of automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

Section 7. Purchase of supplies, materials and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered until contracts covering said purchase have been entered into with the vendors.

Section 8. In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employes and other persons, except inmates by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and maintenance of said institutions.

Further in addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government, or from any other source as contributions for the programs provided herein, or as payment for services or materials furnished by one institution to another, except those collections designated as revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund

and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective appropriations.

Section 9. That part of all appropriations in this act unexpended, uncommitted and unencumbered as of June 30, 1970 shall automatically lapse as of that date.

Section 10. The provisions of this act shall be severable. If any provision of this act is found by a court of record to be unconstitutional and void, the remaining provisions of the act shall, nevertheless, remain valid unless the court finds the valid provisions of the law are so essentially inseparably connected with and depend upon the void provision that it cannot be presumed the General Assembly would have enacted the remaining valid provisions without the void one, or unless the court finds the remaining valid provisions standing alone are incompleated and are incapable of being executed in accordance with the legislative intent.

Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

The item in section two which provides as follows:

“For payments of subsidies to school districts and county boards of school directors on account of basic instruction and vocational education costs: Provided, that the Superintendent of Public Instruction, with the approval of the Governor, may make payments from this appropriation in advance of the due date prescribed by law to school districts which are financially handicapped, whenever he shall deem it necessary to make such advanced payments to enable the school districts to keep their public schools open the sum of seven hundred fifty million eight hundred sixty two thousand dollars (\$750,862,000)”

This item is approved in the amount of six hundred sixty three million seven hundred ninety seven thousand six hundred dollars (\$663,797,600) which is estimated to be sufficient.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE

The item in section two which provides as follows:

“For assistance payments and county administration of the public assistance programs with such payments to be made at the present 90% level of adequacy to December 31, 1969 and after such date payments shall be made at 100% level of adequacy for the balance of the fiscal year 1969-70, provided that it is the legislative intent that the policy to be established by the department for work incentive payments during the 1969-70 fiscal year shall be the same as that established for the 1968-69 fiscal year and shall be in accordance with standards mandated by Federal Law the sum of two hundred forty nine million one hundred thousand dollars (\$249,100,000)”

This item is approved in the amount of two hundred nineteen million one hundred thousand dollars (\$219,100,000) which is estimated to be sufficient.

The item in section two which provides as follows:

“For nursing home care provided that for nursing homes of the II and III classes, average monthly payments shall be increased from \$235 per month to \$335 per month the sum of fourteen million nine hundred thousand dollars (\$14,900,000)”

This item is approved in the sum of fourteen million one hundred thousand dollars (\$14,100,000) which is estimated to be sufficient.

The item in section two which provides as follows:

“For medical assistance payments, provided that it is the legislative intent that such payments shall be based on the same income limits established and employed by the department in determining eligibility for medical assistance payments or services during the fiscal year 1968-69 the sum of one hundred nine million three hundred thousand dollars (\$109,300,000)”

AN ACT

SB 880

Making an appropriation to the Treasury Department out of the Motor License Fund for the purpose of paying the interest and principal requirements on general obligation bonds issued for highway purposes.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of six million five hundred thousand dollars (\$6,500,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Motor License Fund to the Treasury Department for the fiscal year July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970, for the payment of interest and principal requirements on general obligation bonds issued for highway purposes.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.

AN ACT

HB 886

Appropriating moneys in the Land and Water Development Fund derived from the issuance and sale of bonds and notes pursuant to the act of January 19, 1968 (1967 P. L. 996), known as "The Land and Water Conservation and Reclamation Act."

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated for the periods and the purposes specified from moneys in the Land and Water Development Fund derived from the issuance and sale of bonds and notes pursuant to the act of January 19, 1968 (1967 P. L. 996), known as "The Land and Water Conservation and Reclamation Act":

(1) The sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1969, to the Department of Mines and Mineral Industries for the purposes specified in clause (1) of section 16 of the act.

(2) The sum of forty million dollars (\$40,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1969, to the Department of Health for the purposes specified in clause (2) of section 16 of the act: Provided, That expenditures during these two fiscal years shall not exceed twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) in accordance with subsection (c) of section 16 of the act.

(3) The sum of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for two fiscal years beginning July 1, 1969, to the Department of Forests and Waters, Fish and Game Commissions and Historical and Museum Commissions for the purposes specified in clause (3) of section 16 of the act.

Making an appropriation to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives for the purchase of Pennsylvania flags to be sent to residents of Pennsylvania serving in the armed forces of the United States, overseas.

Section 1. The sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970 to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives, for the purchase of Pennsylvania flags to be sent to residents of Pennsylvania serving in the armed forces of the United States, overseas, who request such flags. The appropriation made by this act shall be in addition to any other appropriation made to such persons and for such purposes during the same fiscal year.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

AN ACT

SB 864

Making an appropriation to the Department of Military Affairs from restricted revenue in the Motor License Fund to be used by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the encouragement and development of aeronautics.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of one million nine hundred ninety-four thousand dollars (\$1,994,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account for aviation fuel taxes in the Motor License Fund to the Department of Military Affairs for the fiscal period July 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970, to be used by the Pennsylvania Aeronautics Commission for the encouragement and development of aeronautics, for the development and maintenance of State airports, for assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities of the Commonwealth in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities, including the making of surveys and plans and the necessary construction work and equipment: Provided, however, That no more shall be expended from this item for such purposes or any of them than may be required to match an equal sum contributed by any political subdivision or municipal authority of the Commonwealth or by the Federal Government, or by a political subdivision or municipal authority and the Federal Government as provided in the act of May 2, 1947 (P. L. 136), entitled "An act relating to Federal aid to political subdivision or municipality authority for the development of public airports."

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1969.
