SB 1214

Making appropriations for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses of the Commonwealth Compensation Commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Governor's Office for the purpose of paying its pro-rata share of the costs and expenses of the Commonwealth Compensation Commission as provided in the act of June 16, 1971 (P.L.157).

Section 2. The sum of twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate for the purpose of paying his pro-rata share of the costs and expenses of the Commonwealth Compensation Commission as provided in the act of June 16, 1971 (P.L.157).

Section 3. The sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Speaker of the House of Representatives for the purpose of paying his pro-rata share of the costs and expenses of the Commonwealth Compensation Commission as provided in the act of June 16, 1971 (P.L.157).

Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.

Amending the act of August 31, 1971 (Act No. 62-A), entitled "A supplement to the act of November 30, 1965 (P.L.843), entitled 'An act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Temple University,' making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriation and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated," further providing for appropriations to the Temple University.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Sections 1, 2, 4, 5 and 6, act of August 31, 1971 (Act No. 62-A), entitled "A supplement to the act of November 30, 1965 (P.L.843), entitled 'An act providing for the establishment and operation of Temple University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in tuition; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual report of the operations of Temple University,' making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriation and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated," are amended to read:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of Temple University at Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 1971 to June 30, 1972, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

- (1) For Resident Education—Undergraduate \$13,279,000
- (2) For Resident Education—Graduate 16,229,000
- (3) For First Professional Programs 5,734,000
- (4) For Extension Services [62,000] 52,000

- (5) For Organized Research..... [1,930,000] 1,470,000
- (6) For Special Departmental Research [191,000] 171,000
- (7) For Computer Center..... [1,910,000] 2,400,000
- (8) *For Resident Education—Medical Programs* 5,233,000

Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the appropriations for Resident Education, as provided in section 1 of this act, shall be made on the basis of the number of credit hours produced during the fiscal year, *except payments for medical programs which shall be made on the basis of full-time equivalent enrollment*. The following rates shall be used in the determination of the amount of such payments:

- (1) Undergraduate Programs..... [\$ 25.50] \$ 28.00 per credit hour
- (2) Graduate Programs [124.50] 135.00 per credit hour
- (3) First Professional Programs..... 110.00 per credit hour
- (4) *Medical Programs* 7,465.00 *per full-time equivalent student enrolled*

Section 4. Payments to Temple University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made quarterly during the fiscal year as follows:

- (1) First payment on September 30, 1971.
- (2) Second payment on December 31, 1971.
- (3) Third payment on March 31, 1972.
- (4) Fourth payment on June 30, 1972.

Such quarterly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3 of this act, on the basis of estimates of such credit hours, *full-time equivalent students enrolled in medical programs* and net costs as submitted by Temple University to the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than thirty days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Temple University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than one hundred twenty days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Temple University shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year and the actual credit hours, *full-time equivalent students enrolled in medical programs* and net costs, as provided in sections 2 and 3 of this act, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year. Such statement of expenditures, credit hours, *full-time equivalent students enrolled in medical programs* and net costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Temple University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General

shall also make a determination of such actual credit hours, *full-time equivalent students enrolled in medical programs* and net costs and make certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning said expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. The university shall file on or before [March 1, 1972] *April 1, 1972* with the appropriation committees of the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth in such detail and form as prescribed by the respective appropriation committees of the General Assembly and the Auditor General:

(1) A statement listing all research projects undertaken with State funds provided for from moneys appropriated by this act. Each designated research project shall be accounted for separately.

(2) Progress reports on all projects involving State funds appropriated under the provisions of this act.

(3) A listing of all contracts with the Commonwealth, and the status thereof, as part of their annual fiscal report.

Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for Resident Education, as provided in section 1 of this act, shall be made on the basis of the number of credit hours produced during the fiscal year *except payments for medical programs which shall be made on the basis of full-time equivalent enrollment*. The following rates shall be used in the determination of the amount of such payments:

(1) Undergraduate Programs.....	[\$ 25.50]	\$ 28.00 per credit hour
(2) Graduate Programs	[124.50]	135.00 per credit hour

Section 3. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for Continuing Education, the Computer Center, *Organized Research*, and the University Press, as provided in section 1 of this act, shall be made on the basis of the net costs of such programs. The net cost of each such program shall be the excess of the expenditures made over the income received.

Section 4. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations herein provided shall be made quarterly during the fiscal year as follows:

- (1) First payment on September 30, 1971.
- (2) Second payment on December 31, 1971.
- (3) Third payment on March 31, 1972.
- (4) Fourth payment on June 30, 1972.

Such quarterly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3 of this act on the basis of estimates of such credit hours, *full-time equivalent students enrolled in medical programs*, and net costs as submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the General Assembly and to the treasurer not later than thirty days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than one hundred twenty days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file with the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year and the actual credit hours,

full-time equivalent students enrolled in medical programs and net costs, as provided in sections 2 and 3 of this act, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures, credit hours, *full-time equivalent students enrolled in medical programs* and net costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of such actual credit hours, *full-time equivalent students enrolled in medical programs* and net costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. The university shall file on or before [March 1, 1972] April 1, 1972 with the appropriation committees of the General Assembly and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth in such detail and form as prescribed by the respective appropriation committees of the General Assembly and the Auditor General:

Section 1. SB 1193

Amending the act of August 31, 1971 (Appropriation Act No. 27-A) entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 1971 to June 30, 1972, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1971," changing the use of funds for drug, narcotic and alcohol abuse programs.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 2, act of August 31, 1971 (Appropriation Act No. 27-A), known as "The General Appropriation Act of 1971," is amended by changing the appropriations for drug, narcotics and alcohol abuse programs made to the Departments of Education, Health and Public Welfare and the State Police, to read:

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expense of the duly elected or appointed officers and employes of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees of contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods, services, printing, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1971, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1971.
