Making an appropriation from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the State Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal period July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$3,133,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to the State Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1980 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980 for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the State Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services including the fees for mortgage supervision, money management, control of investments and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1980.

## HB 2658

Making an appropriation from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal period July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$5,611,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1980 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1980.

## HB 2659

Making an appropriation to the Department of Labor and Industry from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to provide for the expenses of administering the Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act and the Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for the fiscal period July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$8,764,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the administration of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as "The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act," and the act of June 21, 1939 (P.L.566, No.284), known as "The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act" for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1980 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1980.

HB 2660

Making an appropriation from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$4,997,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated from the professional licensure augmentation restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Department of State to augment the general government appropriation for the operation of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs for the fiscal period July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1980.

A SUPPLEMENT

SB 1240

To the act of June 18, 1980 (P.L. , No.17A), entitled "An act to provide for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal period July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980, to provide supplemental appropriations from the General Fund to the various departments of the Commonwealth for the fiscal period July 1, 1979 to June 30, 1980," itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth authorized to spend Motor License Fund moneys.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This supplement shall be known and may be cited as the "Motor License Fund Supplement to the General Appropriation Act of 1980."

Section 2. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1980 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980.

To the Department of Transportation

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper administration of the Department of Transportation, including the Transportation Commission and Advisory Committee, and the Statewide coordination of municipal services .....	\$ 17,500,000
For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the administration and operation of the comptroller .....	2,825,000
For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the operation of the highway and safety improvement programs, including planning and research, design, engineering, right-of-way acquisition and the operation of the engineering district facilities and liaison services with communities on local road engineering and construction activities .....	71,300,000

For rental payments to the State Highway and Bridge Authority for projects constructed with funds borrowed by the Authority ..... 32,532,000

For payments to municipalities to assist in maintenance and construction costs of roads in accordance with the act of June 1, 1956 (1955 P.L.1944, No.655), relative to the allocation of highway funds realized from the per gallon tax on liquid fuels ..... 89,888,000

For supplemental payments to municipalities to assist in maintenance and construction costs of roads in accordance with the act of June 1, 1956 (1955 P.L.1944, No.655)..... 5,000,000

For payment from the restricted revenue account for aviation fuel taxes for airport construction and development including encouragement and development of aeronautics, development of State airports, assistance to political subdivisions and municipal authorities in the construction and improvement of airports and other aeronautical facilities ..... 1,500,000

No more shall be expended from this item for such purpose or any of them than may be required to match an equal sum contributed by any political subdivision, or municipality authority of the Commonwealth or by the Federal Government, or by a political subdivision or municipality authority and the Federal Government as provided in the act of May 2, 1947 (P.L.136, No.56), entitled "An act relating to Federal aid to political subdivision or municipality authority for the development of public airports."

## HB 2724

Appropriating the Federal Augmentation to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth and establishing restricted receipts accounts for the fiscal period July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Federal Augmentation Appropriation Act of 1980."

Section 2. The following abbreviations when used in this act shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

Section 3. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the

Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1980 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June 30, 1980.

I. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT  
To the Governor

(a) Office of Budget and Administration

The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to supplement the sum appropriated from Commonwealth revenues for administration:

Section 8. All moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions or supplements to the departments or agencies of the Commonwealth or the programs herein provided shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purpose of the respective appropriations.

Section 9. Federal funds available for costs and damages resulting from natural disasters or civil disobedience may be added to an appropriation contained herein or to funds appropriated or may be used for the purposes prescribed by the Federal Government.

Section 10. Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the extent that such funds are estimated as being available during the fiscal year of the Commonwealth.

Section 11. (a) Any Federal money which has been previously appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated by the Federal Government but remains unspent from prior fiscal years, and will not be renewed for fiscal year 1980-1981, is hereby appropriated.

(b) With the exception of Federal money received under the law enforcement assistance administration and Title XX social and rehabilitative services subgrants, subgrants may be made between appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly. The Budget Secretary shall submit a list of subgrants to the Chairman of the

House and Senate Appropriations Committee quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made from a restricted receipt without a specific appropriation by the General Assembly.

Section 12. In addition to the moneys appropriated by this act, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the purpose of disaster assistance or relief shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the departments, boards, commissions or agencies designated by the Governor.

Section 13. In the event of any emergency situation in which the Legislature cannot act in sufficient time, the Governor is authorized through Executive authorization to provide up to \$5,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the emergency situation. For the purposes of this section "emergency" is defined as any situation in which there is a chance of, or may result in, substantial human suffering.

Section 14. This act shall take effect July 1, 1980 or immediately if enacted after July 1, 1980.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses . . . . .	\$94,704,000
(2) For cost of student aid. . . . .	1,760,000
(3) For cost of agricultural research. . . . .	10,266,000
(4) For cost of agricultural extension services. . . . .	8,688,000
(5) For cost of research. . . . .	8,626,000
(6) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only . . . . .	2,896,000
(7) For cost of soil survey . . . . .	100,000

Section 2. Payments to Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time students enrollment at a rate not to exceed \$7,465 per student.

Section 3. If necessary, the Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to the Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated costs and full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General Appropriation Act of 1980 relating to the payment of retirement expenses, the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University shall make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act.

Section 6. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the Pennsylvania State University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in sections 2 and 3, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures and number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the Pennsylvania State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. Each such report, to be submitted prior to October 1, 1981, shall cover the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1980 and shall include for each term during the period:



(1) The following counts and distributions:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full-time, of faculty members employed part-time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) A distribution of faculty members employed part-time by the percentage of full-time employment.

(iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of students receiving individual instruction at each level of instruction.

(v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) Two classifications: one, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and two, a classification of faculty members and other professional employees by school and department to be subdivided by type of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each subdivision in each classification:

(i) The number.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) Total salary paid.

(vi) Total salary paid from college or university funds.

(vii) Total salary paid from Federal funds.

(viii) Total salary paid from other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full-time identified by school, department and title:

An analysis of the average hours per week spent in college or university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 8. In addition to the above requirements relative to this appropriation, each report covering the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1980, shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1978, 1979, 1980 and estimated 1981.

The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with "Higher Education Finance Manual" (1975).

Section 9. The university shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 10. The Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher Education Finance Manual" United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975) with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1980-1981." Credits granted for nontraditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service."

Section 11. In addition to the requirements of section 7, the Pennsylvania State University shall, by March 1, 1980, submit to the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives a breakdown of the funds budgeted for this fiscal year for the main campus and each branch campus including expenditures budgeted from this act and expenditures budgeted from moneys other than those appropriated by this act.

Section 12. This act shall take effect July 1, 1980.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981, for the purpose and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses . . . . .	\$62,948,000
(2) For operations of the Titusville Campus . . . . .	500,000
(3) For cost of student aid . . . . .	2,960,000
(4) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only . . . . .	4,061,000
(5) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry . . . . .	600,000

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time student enrollment at a rate not to exceed \$7,465 per student.

Section 3. If necessary the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1, paragraphs (1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs and full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures, and number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. - (2) For cost of student aid . . . . . 3,018,000
- (3) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only . . . . . 5,412,000

## SB 1535

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums or as much thereof as may be necessary are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$94,704,000
(2) For cost of student aid .....	1,760,000
(3) For cost of agricultural research .....	10,266,000
(4) For cost of agricultural extension services....	8,688,000
(5) For cost of research .....	8,626,000
(6) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only...	2,896,000
(7) For cost of soil survey.....	100,000

Section 2. Payments to Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time students enrollment at a rate not to exceed \$7,465 per student.

Section 3. If necessary, the Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1, clauses (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to the Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated costs and full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General Appropriation Act of 1980 relating to the payment of retirement expenses, the Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University shall make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act.

Section 6. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the Pennsylvania State University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, and with the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in sections 2 and 3, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures and number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the Pennsylvania State University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. Each such report, to be submitted prior to October 1, 1981, shall cover the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1980 and shall include for each term during the period:

(1) The following counts and distributions:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full-time, of faculty members employed part-time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) A distribution of faculty members employed part-time by the percentage of full-time employment.

(iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of students receiving individual instruction at each level of instruction.

(v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) Two classifications: one, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and two, a classification of faculty members and other professional employees by school and department to be subdivided by type of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each subdivision in each classification:

(i) The number.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) Total salary paid.

(vi) Total salary paid from college or university funds.

(vii) Total salary paid from Federal funds.

(viii) Total salary paid from other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full-time identified by school, department and title:

An analysis of the average hours per week spent in college or university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 8. In addition to the above requirements relative to this appropriation, each report covering the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1980, shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1978, 1979, 1980 and estimated 1981.

The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with "Higher Education Finance Manual" (1975).

Section 9. The university shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 10. The Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher Education Finance Manual" United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975) with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1980-1981." Credits granted for nontraditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service."

Section 11. In addition to the requirements of section 7, the Pennsylvania State University shall, by March 1, 1980, submit to the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives a breakdown of the funds budgeted for this fiscal year for the main campus and each branch campus including expenditures budgeted from this act and expenditures budgeted from moneys other than those appropriated by this act.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1981, for the purpose and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses . . . . .	\$62,948,000
(2) For operations of the Titusville Campus . . . . .	500,000
(3) For cost of student aid . . . . .	2,960,000
(4) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only . . . . .	4,061,000
(5) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry . . . . .	600,000

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items, as provided in section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made on the basis of full-time student enrollment at a rate not to exceed \$7,465 per student.

Section 3. If necessary the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1, paragraphs (1) and (2): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs and full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, the number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

Such statement of expenditures, and number of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor General shall also make a determination of full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a certification as to their correctness. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. Each such report, to be submitted prior to October 1, 1981, shall cover the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1980 and shall include for each term during the period:

(1) The following counts and distributions:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full-time, of faculty members employed part-time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses, and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.



(ii) A distribution of faculty members employed part-time by the percentage of full-time employment.

(iii) Total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iv) Number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of students receiving individual instruction at each level of instruction.

(v) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) Two classifications: one, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and two, a classification of faculty members and other professional employees by school and department to be subdivided by type of assignment: instructional or noninstructional divided into teaching and nonteaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time; and the following aggregates for each subdivision in each classification:

(i) The number.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) Total salary paid.

(vi) Total salary paid from college or university funds.

(vii) Total salary paid from Federal funds.

(viii) Total salary paid from other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full-time identified by school, department and title:

An analysis of the average hours per week spent in college or university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours

spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 7. In addition to the above requirements relative to this appropriation, each report covering the 12-month period beginning September 1, 1980, shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees, and doctoral degrees awarded in 1978, 1979, 1980 and estimated 1981.

The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with "Higher Education Finance Manual" (1975).

Section 8. The university shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education may prescribe.

Section 9. The university shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher Education Finance Manual" United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975) with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1980-1981." Credits granted for nontraditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service."

Section 10. In addition to the requirements of section 6, the University of Pittsburgh shall, by March 1, 1981, submit to the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives a breakdown of the funds budgeted for this fiscal year for the main campus and each branch campus including expenditures budgeted from this act and expenditures budgeted from moneys other than those appropriated by this act.

Section 11. All sums of money paid to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh pursuant to the appropriation of the act of July 11, 1980 (No.32A), entitled "A supplement to the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled 'An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from

taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh,' making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations, and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated," shall be credited toward and deducted from the amount appropriated in this act.

Section 12. The act of July 11, 1980 (No.32A), entitled "A supplement to the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled 'An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh,' making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations, and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated," is repealed.

For the payment of the expenses of the Committee on Appropriations (R) of the Senate for investigating schools, colleges, universities, correctional institutions, mental hospitals, medical and surgical hospitals, homes and other institutions and agencies supported, in whole or in part, by appropriations from the State Treasury in analyzing reports, expenditures, and the general operation and administration of said institutions and agencies in examining and analyzing requests of the same and of the various departments, boards and commissions of the Commonwealth, and for the collection of data from other states attending seminars, conferences, and in cooperating and exchanging information with legislative budget and financial committees of other states, and for the necessary clerical assistance and other assistance, travel expenses and all other expenses deemed necessary by the chairman in compiling data and information connected with the work of said committee in compiling comparative cost and other fiscal data and information for the use of said committee and the Senate during Legislative Sessions and during the interim between Legislative Sessions to the discharge of such duties. The committee shall have the authority to examine and inspect all properties, equipment, facilities, files, records and accounts of any State office, department, institution, board, committee, commission or agency or any institution or agency supported, in whole or in part, by appropriation from the State Treasury and to administer oaths. The Appropriations Committee may issue subpoenas under the hand and seal of the chairman to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of any papers, books, accounts, documents and testimony touching matters properly being inquired into by the committee and to cause the deposition of witnesses either residing within or without the State to be taken in the manner prescribed by laws for taking depositions in civil actions. Upon presentation of requisitions by the chairman of such committee of the Senate for such compensation or expenses, such shall be paid on warrant of the State Treasurer directly to and in favor of the persons designated in such requisition as entitled to receive such compensation or expenses. Such chairman shall, not later than 30 days after the termination of his term of office, or until his successor is elected, and also within 30 days after the adjournment of any regular or

special session, file an account together with supporting documents whenever possible, in the office of the Committee on Appropriations (R) of the Senate of his expenses since the filing of the prior account.

For the Special Leadership Account (D) for payment of salaries, wages and all other incidental expenses incurred in hiring personnel and staff for services which in the opinion of the Floor Leader (D) may be required or arise during Legislative Sessions and during the interim between Legislative Sessions and for the payment of all other expenses related to the performance of his duties and responsibilities. Upon presentation of requisitions by the Floor Leader (D) of the Senate for such compensation or expenses, such shall be paid on warrant of the State Treasurer directly to and in favor of the persons designated in such requisition as entitled to receive such compensation or expenses. The Floor Leader (D) shall, not later than 30 days after the termination of his term of office or until his successor is elected and also within 30 days after the adjournment of any regular or special session, file an account together with supporting documents whenever possible in the office of the Floor Leader (D) of such expenses since the filing of the prior account.

For the Special Leadership Account (R) for payment of salaries, wages and all other incidental expenses incurred in hiring personnel and staff for services which in the opinion of the Floor Leader (R) may be required or arise during Legislative Sessions and during the interim between Legislative Sessions and for the payment of all other expenses related to the performance of his duties and responsibilities. Upon presentation of requisitions by the Floor Leader (R) of the Senate for such compensation or expenses, such shall be paid on warrant of the State Treasurer directly to and in favor of the persons designated in such requisition as entitled to receive such compensation or expenses. The Floor Leader (R) shall, not later than 30 days after the termination of his term of office or until his successor is elected and also within 30 days after the adjournment of any regular or special session, file an account together with supporting documents whenever possible in the office of the Floor Leader (R) of such expenses since the filing of the prior account.

Upon presentation of requisitions by the Chief Clerk of the Senate for such compensation or expenses, such shall be paid on warrant of the State Treasurer directly to and in favor of the persons designated in such requisitions as entitled to receive such compensation or expenses. An accounting, together with supporting documents whenever possible, shall be filed in the Office of the Chief Clerk of such expenses since the filing of the prior account .....

Section 5. (a) The appropriations in section 1 insofar as they relate to the Auditor General and the Chairman of the Rules Committee (D) in the Senate are new appropriations in addition to any appropriations made pursuant to the act of June 18, 1980 (No.17A).

(b) The appropriations in sections 1 and 2 insofar as they relate to the Pennsylvania Crime Commission and the Legislative Management Committee (R) of the Senate are supplemental appropriations to be added with the appropriations made pursuant to the act of June 18, 1980 (No.17A) or the act of June 30, 1980 (No.22A).

(c) The language provisions in section 1 relating to the Senate Appropriations Committee and the Special Leadership Accounts of the Senate are intended to replace the language set forth in the act of June 18, 1980 (No.17A) but are not intended to affect in any manner the appropriations made for such purposes.

Section 6. The appropriation to the Emergency Management Agency and the language relating to the Senate Appropriations Committees and the Special Leadership Accounts of the Senate as set forth in section 201 of the act of June 18, 1980 (No.17A) are repealed.

Section 7. Except for the appropriations and language relating to the Senate in section 1 which shall take effect January 1, 1981, the remainder of this act shall take effect immediately.

Making an appropriation to the Department of Environmental Resources for certain flood warning systems.

The sum of \$5,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby specifically appropriated to the Department of Environmental Resources for allocation to qualified counties solely for the operation and maintenance of enhanced Flash Flood/Flood Warning Systems developed in cooperation with the National Weather Service, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.
