SB 1439

Making appropriations from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry to provide for the expenses of administering The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act and The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$15,224,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Workmen's Compensation Administration Fund to the Department of Labor and Industry for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the administration of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), known as The Pennsylvania Workmen's Compensation Act, and the act of June 21, 1939 (P.L.566, No.284), known as The Pennsylvania Occupational Disease Act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1988, or immediately, whichever is later.

Making an appropriation from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Consumer Advocate.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$2,738,000 is hereby appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Consumer Advocate to provide for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1988, or immediately, whichever is later.

HB 2196

Making appropriations from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to provide for the operation of the commission for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, for the purposes and in the amounts shown:

(1) For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper operation and administration of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.		
State appropriation.....		\$27,931,000
(i) The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated to supplement the sum authorized to be billed to utilities for the operation of the commission:		
(A) "Natural Gas Pipeline Safety" - To enforce the regulations of the Natural Gas Pipeline Safety Act.		
Federal appropriation.....	115,000	
(B) "Railroad Safety" - For safety inspectors to survey and patrol over 14,000 miles of trackage to eliminate derailment and provide safe rail travel.		
Federal appropriation.....	350,000	

Any Federal funds which the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission receives pursuant to these appropriations shall not be credited to any utility nor used to lower the annual assessment of any utility.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1988, or immediately, whichever is later.

AN ACT

HB 2411

Making appropriations from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account and from restricted revenue accounts within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs in support of the professional licensure boards assigned thereto.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$12,218,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account within the General Fund to the Department of State for the operation of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989.

Section 2. (a) The sum of \$1,644,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Medicine, as authorized by section 907(a) of the act of October 15, 1975 (P.L.390, No.111), known as the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989.

(b) The sum of \$312,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, as authorized by section 907(b) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989.

(c) The sum of \$129,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts account of the State Board of Podiatry, as authorized by section 907(c) of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, for the operation of said board for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989.

(d) Each appropriation listed in subsections (a), (b) and (c) shall not be treated as an augmentation to the Department of State, general government appropriation or any other appropriation, but shall be treated and accounted for as separate appropriations respectively.

Section 3. The additional sum of \$800,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional Licensure Augmentation Account within the General Fund to the Department of State for the operation of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs for the fiscal year July 1, 1987, to June 30, 1988. This sum shall be an addition to any appropriation under the act of July 1, 1987 (P.L.458, No.8A).

Section 4. This act shall take effect as follows:

- (1) Sections 3 and 4 shall take effect immediately.

(2) The remainder of this act shall take effect July 1, 1988, or immediately, whichever is later.

Making an appropriation from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$12,640,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Public School Employees' Retirement Fund to the Public School Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the Public School Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1988, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1436

Making an appropriation from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the State Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$6,031,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to the State Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the State Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988. Of this sum, not more than \$395,000 shall be expended to open and operate field counseling sites in Pittsburgh and North East, Pennsylvania.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1988, or immediately, whichever is later.

HB 2570

Itemizing appropriations required from the Motor License Fund and The State Stores Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, for the proper operation of the several departments of the Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License Fund and The State Stores Fund moneys.

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The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

PART I
GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 101. Appropriations.—(a) Motor License Fund.—The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation and

travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

(b) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account.—The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Commonwealth for the purposes set forth herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

(c) State Stores Fund.—The following sum, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the hereinafter named agency of the Commonwealth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

For reinvestment in Department of Transportation facilities.

State appropriation..... 3,000,000

For rest area improvements.

Section 221. Department of Transportation.—The following amounts are appropriated to the Department of Transportation:

For payment for aviation operations, including the operation and maintenance of State-owned aircraft, payment of general expenses, supplies, printing and equipment; for the development and maintenance of State airports and the maintenance and repair of landing fields, intermediate landing fields, landing field equipment, beacon sites and other navigation facilities; and for the encouragement and development of civil aeronautics.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 301. Lapsing of unused funds.—(a) Except as otherwise provided by law or in subsection (b), that part of all appropriations in Part II unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, 1989, shall automatically lapse as of that date.

(b) (1) The appropriation in section 201 for traffic signs and directional signs shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(2) The appropriations in section 221 for airport development, runway rehabilitation, business airport grants and real estate tax rebate payments shall be two-year continuing appropriations.

Section 302. Effective date.—This act shall take effect July 1, 1988, or immediately, whichever is later.

A SUPPLEMENT

SB 1443

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$154,184,000
(2) For cost of research.....	13,476,000
(3) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only.....	4,287,000
(4) For cost of agricultural research.....	16,039,000
(5) For cost of agricultural extension services.....	18,325,000
(6) For the cost of operating Elizabethtown Hospital....	4,515,000
(7) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	200,000

Section 2. Payments to The Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, The Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1(1), (2), (4) and (5): Provided, That the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to The Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by The Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General Appropriation Act of 1988 relating to the payment of retirement expenses, the Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University shall make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act.

Section 6. (a) The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, The Pennsylvania State University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by The Pennsylvania State University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 7. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall include data for all programs except the Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 1989, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1988 and shall include:

(1) The following counts and distributions for each term during the period:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed full time, of faculty members employed part time, of full-time students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled in undergraduate courses.

(ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels, and of graduate student credit hours, divided into three course levels—master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction scheduled by level of instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) categories of instructional programs of higher education as defined by the National Center for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education.

(iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.

(2) For the summer term and the following academic year in total and for each two-digit CIP program category, a classification of faculty members or other professional employees by title, including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type of assignment: teaching and non-teaching, and each such set of faculty members or other professional employees to be further subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time and the following aggregates for each such subdivided classification:

(i) The number of faculty and other professional employees and their full-time equivalence in instructional and noninstructional functions.

(ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(v) The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction student credit hours generated, divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

(vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary paid for each of these functions from university funds, Federal funds and other funds.

(3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty member employed full time identified by two-digit CIP program category and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the average hours per week spent in university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public service.

Section 8. In addition to the requirements in section 7 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1988 shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1986, 1987, 1988 and estimated 1989.

Section 9. The Pennsylvania State University shall provide such information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this act and in such form and manner as the Department of Education shall prescribe.

Section 10. The Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual, United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities."

Section 11. This act shall take effect July 1, 1988, or immediately, whichever is later.

APPROVED—The 13th day of July, A. D. 1988, except as to the following:

Section 1. * * *

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PART II. GENERAL FUND AND FEDERAL APPROPRIATIONS

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 101. Short title.—This act shall be known and may be cited as the First Supplemental Appropriation Act to the General Appropriation Act of 1988.

and expenses, including payment to the Department of General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that provided under the State medical assistance program.

Section 104. State appropriations.—(a) General Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

(b) Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

(c) Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund.—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.—The following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1988.

Unless otherwise stated, the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal year.

Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations.—The following sums as set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the program stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988.

Section 107. Block grants.—(a) **Appropriation.**—The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1988.

(b) **Small Communities Development Block Grant.**—The Small Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small cities and communities that have a high concentration of impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their low and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet community development needs.

(c) **Community Services Block Grant.**—The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) **Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.**—The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG) will be used for the administration and provision of education programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

(e) **Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.**—The Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is for the provision of preventive health and other health services related to emergency medical comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and rodent control.

(f) **Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.**—The Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to assure mothers and children access to quality maternal and child health services, to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of preventable disease and handicapping conditions among children, to provide rehabilitative services for blind and disabled individuals under the age of 16 receiving Supplemental Security Income benefits and to provide medical services for children with crippling conditions.

(g) **Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant.**—The Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block Grant

(ADAMHSBG) will be used for the administration and provision of drug and alcohol abuse services and community mental health services in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

(h) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.—The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals.

(i) Social Services Block Grant.—The Social Services Block Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible persons.

PART VI

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 601. Prior laws unaffected.—This act is not intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal any provision of any act enacted at this or any prior session of the General Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the ordering of printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of automobiles, the method of making payments from the State Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any administrative department, board or commission.

Section 602. Compliance with other law before funds available.—No appropriation made by this act to any department, board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be available unless and until the department, board, commission or agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.

Section 603. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or committing funds.—Funds for the purchase of supplies, materials and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered until contracts covering the purchase have been entered into with the vendors.

Section 604. Minority business set-asides.—(a) Each department or other instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed in Subpart A of Part II, authorized to contract for buildings, highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services, shall report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.

(b) As used in this section, the term “minority business” means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.

Section 605. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous sources.—

(a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and maintenance of the institutions.

(b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from any other source, except the Federal Government, as contributions for the programs provided herein or as payment for services or materials furnished by one institution to another, except those collections designated as revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective appropriations.

(c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by this act, all moneys received by a department or agency of the Commonwealth from any other sources, except the Federal Government, as contributions or supplements to the department or agency for a program or administration of an act included in this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the appropriation for that program or administration of the act.

Section 606. Lapsing of unused funds.—(a) Except as otherwise provided by law or in subsections (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h) and (i), that part of all appropriations in Parts II, III, IV and V unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June 30, 1989, shall automatically lapse as of that date.

(b) The appropriation in Part II to the Department of Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(c) The appropriation in Part II to the Department of Environmental Resources for the Chesapeake Bay Pollution Abatement Program shall be a continuing appropriation.

(d) The appropriation in Part II to the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency for loan forgiveness shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(e) The appropriations in Part II to the Legislative Department shall be continuing appropriations.

(f) The appropriations in section 301 of Part III shall be two-year continuing appropriations.

(g) The appropriations in Part IV to the Department of Commerce for business infrastructure development, the small business incubator programs and the industrial resource centers shall be two-year continuing appropriations.

(h) The appropriation in Part IV to the Department of Community Affairs for recreational improvement and rehabilitation assistance shall be a two-year continuing appropriation.

(i) Notwithstanding provisions of section 1008(a) of the act of July 3, 1987 (P.L.459, No.9A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1987, appropriations in section 401 relating to small business incubators - Loans or Grants, higher educational industrial resource centers, and business infrastructure development shall be continuing until June 30, 1989.

Section 607. Construction with prior appropriation acts.—Any appropriation in Parts II, III and IV of this act which is the same as or similar to an appropriation in the act of June 29, 1988 (P.L.1956, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1988, shall replace that appropriation.

Section 608. Deduction of expended appropriations under prior law.—Any money that has been appropriated and expended under the act of June 29, 1988 (P.L.1956, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1988, shall be deducted from the corresponding appropriation in this act.

Section 609. Partial repeals.—

(1) As much of section 206 of the act of June 29, 1988 (P.L.1956, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1988, as relates to transfers to the Sunny Day Fund and the Tax Stabilization Reserve Fund are repealed.

(2) As much of section 209 of the act of June 29, 1988 (P.L.1956, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1988, as relates to marketing to attract business to the Commonwealth and marketing to attract tourist to the Commonwealth are repealed.

(3) As much of section 210 of the act of June 29, 1988 (P.L.1956, No.5A), known as the General Appropriation Act of 1988, as relates to Federal augmentation appropriations for Centralia Recovery and the ARC-Innovative Housing Program are repealed.

PART VII EFFECTIVE DATE

Section 701. Effective date.—This act shall take effect immediately.

Appropriating money from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for various projects throughout this Commonwealth for fiscal year 1988-1989.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, for the projects listed to enhance economic development and the creation of jobs in this Commonwealth in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1 of the act of July 1, 1985 (P.L.120, No.32), known as the Sunny Day Fund Act.

Section 2. The following amounts are appropriated to the Department of Commerce to induce companies to locate large industrial, manufacturing or research and development enterprises within this Commonwealth:

(1) For the purpose of making a loan to Epsilon Products, Incorporated, to locate a manufacturing facility in Marcus Hook, Delaware County. It is estimated that this project will create 200 new jobs within three years of operation.

State appropriation..... \$3,000,000

(2) For the purpose of providing interest and/or principal guarantee to induce Shea Communications, Incorporated, or its affiliate to locate a printing facility in York County. It is estimated that this project will create 500 new jobs within three years of operation.

State appropriation..... 7,500,000

(3) For the purpose of making a loan to Allegheny Ludlum, Incorporated, to assist in its acquisition of the USX Vandergrift facility in Westmoreland County. It is estimated that this project will create approximately 300 jobs within three years of operation.

State appropriation..... 3,750,000

(4) For the purpose of making a loan to Glass Adventures, Incorporated, or its affiliate, to locate a glass manufacturing facility in Washington County. It is estimated that this project will create approximately 500 new jobs within three years of operation.

State appropriation..... 6,000,000

(5) For the purpose of making a loan to Alugas of Pennsylvania, Incorporated, to locate a manufacturing facility in Allegheny County. It is estimated that this project will create 367 jobs within three years of operation.

State appropriation..... 5,500,000

(6) For the purpose of making a loan to UNISYS to locate its corporate training facility in Montgomery County. It is expected that this project will create 300 new jobs within three years of operation.

State appropriation..... 3,500,000

(7) For the purpose of making a loan to PPG Industries, Inc., to locate its Chemical Division Research and Development Group in Monroeville, Allegheny County. It is expected that this project will create 250 new jobs within three years of operation.

State appropriation..... 3,750,000

Section 3. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the appropriations in section 2 shall be loaned at an annual interest rate that in no case shall be less than the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority's rate for the area in which the project is located and for a term that shall be the same as the term for an equivalent Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority project. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to make the investment in the enterprise development as specified in section 2 shall be liable for the repayment of all Sunny Day Fund moneys, including any accrued interest thereon and any penalties set by the Secretary of Commerce. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to create the number of jobs specified in the approved loan or other agreements with the Commonwealth shall be liable for a penalty equal to an increase in the interest charged to 2% greater than the current prime interest rate for the remainder of the loan, unless the penalty is waived by the Secretary of Commerce because the failure is due to circumstances outside the control of the private company. The Secretary of Commerce shall consult with the chairmen of the Appropriations Committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives prior to the establishment of waiver of penalties.

Section 4. For a period equal to the term of assistance provided each project approved under this act, the Department of Commerce shall provide a written report on the status of each project to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives by June 30 of each year. This report shall contain, at a minimum, information pertaining to the specific use of the Sunny Day Fund money, the interest rate and term of the Sunny Day Fund loan, the amount of principal outstanding and interest due on the loan, and the number of jobs created by the project. All recipients of funds under this act shall be required to provide any and all information requested by the Department of Commerce for the purpose of this act.

Section 5. No funds under this act shall be awarded by the Department of Commerce after June 30, 1989. Any funds from this appropriation remaining unexpended or unencumbered on June 30, 1990, shall automatically lapse into the Sunny Day Fund.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.
