HB 1323

Making an appropriation from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to provide for expenses of the State Employees' Retirement Board for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$13,830,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the State Employees' Retirement Fund to the State Employees' Retirement Board for the payment of all salaries, wages and other compensation and travel expenses of the employees and members of the State Employees' Retirement Board, for contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities of the board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1992, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

HB 2467

**Making appropriations from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, the Office of Consumer Advocate in the Office of the Attorney General and the Office of Small Business Advocate in the Department of Commerce.**

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to provide for the operation of the commission for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, for the purposes and in the amounts shown:

(1) For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper operation and administration of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, excluding the chairman and commissioners and the Bureau of Safety and Enforcement.		

State appropriation.....		\$27,727,000
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(i) The following Federal augmentation amounts, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated to supplement the sum authorized to be billed to utilities for the operation of the commission:

(A) "Natural Gas Pipeline Safety" - To enforce the regulations of the Natural Gas Pipeline Safety Act.

Federal appropriation.....	115,000
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Any Federal funds which the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission receives pursuant to these appropriations shall not be credited to any utility nor used to lower the annual assessment of any utility.

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the chairman and the commissioners.

State appropriation..... 509,000

For the salaries, wages and all necessary expenses for the proper operation and administration of the Bureau of Safety and Enforcement.

State appropriation..... 5,264,000

Section 2. The sum of \$3,439,000 is hereby appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Consumer Advocate in the Office of the Attorney General to provide for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993.

Section 3. The sum of \$735,000 is hereby appropriated from the restricted revenue account within the General Fund to the Office of Small Business Advocate in the Department of Commerce to provide for the operation of that office for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

## A SUPPLEMENT

## SB 1747

To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry the same into effect, the following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$189,319,000
(2) For medical education.....	9,084,000
(3) For the Central Pennsylvania Psychiatric Institute...	1,568,000
(4) For the cost of agricultural research.....	18,835,000
(5) For cost of agricultural extension services.....	19,787,000
(6) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	300,000
(7) For the Pennsylvania College of Technology.....	9,186,000
(8) For debt service related to the former Williamsport Area Community College.....	1,608,000

Section 2. Payments to The Pennsylvania State University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, The Pennsylvania State University may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1(1), (3) and (4), provided that the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to The Pennsylvania State University of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by The Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any provision of the General Appropriation Act of 1992 relating to the payment of retirement expenses, the Trustees of The Pennsylvania State University shall make all required payments to the State Employees' Retirement Fund from the funds appropriated pursuant to this act.

Section 6. (a) The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, The Pennsylvania State University shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by The Pennsylvania State University to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 7. The report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1992 shall include for all programs of the university:

(1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1990, 1991, 1992 and estimated 1993.

Section 8. The Pennsylvania State University shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Education or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 9. The Pennsylvania State University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance Manual, United States Department of Health, Education and Welfare (1975)" and the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and Universities."

Section 10. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1760

Making appropriations to the Trustees of the Berean Training and Industrial School at Philadelphia.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. (a) The sum of \$1,298,000 is hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the Berean Training and Industrial School at Philadelphia for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, for operation and maintenance of the school.

(b) The sum of \$98,000 is hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the Berean Training and Industrial School for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, for payment of debt services to the Commonwealth.

Section 2. Payments to the Berean Training and Industrial School on account of the appropriation in section 1(a) shall be made by the Secretary of Education in equal quarterly payments.

Section 3. The Berean Training and Industrial School shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Education or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1761

**Making appropriations to the Downingtown Industrial and Agricultural School, Downingtown.**

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$872,000 is hereby appropriated to the Downingtown Industrial and Agricultural School, Downingtown, for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, for operation and maintenance of the school.

Section 2. The sum of \$78,000 is hereby appropriated to the Downingtown Industrial and Agricultural School for payment of debts incurred prior to July 1, 1984.

Section 3. The sum of \$49,000 is hereby appropriated to the Downingtown Industrial and Agricultural School for special projects.

Section 4. Payments to the Downingtown Industrial and Agricultural School on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made by the Secretary of Education in equal quarterly payments.

Section 5. The Downingtown Industrial and Agricultural School shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Education or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1779

Making an appropriation to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the general maintenance and operation of the University of Pennsylvania Museum.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sum of \$183,000 is hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, for the general maintenance of the University of Pennsylvania Museum and the purchase of such apparatus and equipment as the trustees may deem necessary for the best interest of the University of Pennsylvania Museum.

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pennsylvania Museum on account of the appropriation provided in section 1 shall be made quarterly by the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission.

Section 3. The Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

SB 1748

To the act of July 28, 1966 (3rd Sp.Sess., P.L.87, No.3), entitled "An act providing for the establishment and operation of the University of Pittsburgh as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve as a State-related university in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; providing for public support and capital improvements; authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within the Commonwealth; requiring the chancellor to make an annual report of the operations of the University of Pittsburgh," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect; providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations; and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, for the purposes and in the amounts as shown:

(1) For educational and general expenses.....	\$119,314,000
(2) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only.....	6,239,000
(3) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry.....	1,030,000
(4) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	300,000
(5) For general maintenance and operation of the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic.....	7,693,000
(6) For the teen suicide center at the Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic.....	497,000

Section 2. Payments to the University of Pittsburgh on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

Section 3. If necessary, the University of Pittsburgh may transfer funds between the appropriations listed in section 1(1) and (2), provided that the aggregate amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically appropriated for that purpose.

Section 4. (a) Payments to the University of Pittsburgh of the appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly during the fiscal year.

(b) Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the provisions of section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs shall

be submitted by the University of Pittsburgh to the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not later than 30 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.

Section 5. (a) The University of Pittsburgh shall apply the moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, the University of Pittsburgh shall file, with the Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, the Auditor General of the Commonwealth and the chief administrator of each branch campus, a statement setting forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts during said fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a basis for receipt of any appropriation during said fiscal year.

(b) Such statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth, and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such sums to be recovered and paid by the University of Pittsburgh to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the right to review only, and he shall file annually with the General Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the General Assembly or any of its committees may require.

Section 6. The report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1992 shall include for all programs of the university:

(2) For instruction - Doctor of Medicine only.....	8,305,000
(3) For operation of dental clinics in the school of dentistry.....	1,030,000
(4) To enhance the recruitment and retention of disadvantaged students.....	300,000
(5) For maxillofacial prosthodontics.....	96,000

Section 2. Payments to Temple University on account of the appropriations for all items as provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.

The Beacon Lodge Camp shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be required by the Department of Public Welfare or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate or the majority chairman or the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1992, or immediately, whichever is later.

AN ACT

SB 1812

Appropriating money from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for various projects throughout this Commonwealth for fiscal year 1992-1993.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of Commerce for the fiscal year July 1, 1992, to June 30, 1993, for the projects listed in this act to enhance economic development and the creation of jobs in this Commonwealth in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1 of the act of July 1, 1985 (P.L.120, No.32), known as the Sunny Day Fund Act.

Section 2. The following amounts are appropriated to the Department of Commerce to induce companies to locate large industrial, manufacturing or research and development enterprises within this Commonwealth:

(1) For the purpose of making a loan to Murry's, Inc., a vertically integrated meat and poultry processing company, to expand its existing facility in Lebanon through the construction of an 80,000 square foot processing and distribution facility in the city of Lebanon's enterprise zone. Murry's, Inc., will invest at least \$12,000,000 into the project, which will create approximately 200 new jobs within three years of operation..... \$1,000,000

(2) For the purpose of making a loan to U.S. Bioscience, a company involved in the development and commercialization of new cancer treatments and allied diseases, to locate a pharmaceutical production facility in Chester or Montgomery County. U.S. Bioscience will invest at least \$50,000,000 into the project, which will create approximately 270 new jobs within three years of operation..... \$2,000,000

Section 3. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the appropriations in section 2 shall be loaned at an annual interest rate that in no case shall be less than the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority's rate for the area in which the project is located and for a term that shall be the same as the term for an equivalent Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority project. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to make the investment in the enterprise development as specified in section 2 shall be liable for the repayment of all Sunny Day Fund moneys, including any accrued interest thereon and any penalties set by the Secretary of Commerce. Private companies which receive Sunny Day Fund



assistance but fail to create the number of jobs specified in the approved loan or other agreements with the Commonwealth shall be liable for a penalty equal to an increase in the interest charged to 2% greater than the current prime interest rate for the remainder of the loan, unless the penalty is waived by the Secretary of Commerce because the failure is due to circumstances outside the control of the private company. The Secretary of Commerce shall consult with the chairmen of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives prior to the establishment of waiver of penalties.

Section 4. For a period equal to the term of assistance provided each project under this act, the Department of Commerce shall provide a written report on the status of each project to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives by June 30 of each year. This report shall contain, at a minimum, information pertaining to the specific use of the Sunny Day Fund money, the interest rate and term of the Sunny Day Fund loan, the amount of principal outstanding and interest due on the loan and the number of jobs created by the project. All recipients of funds under this act shall be required to provide any and all information required by the Department of Commerce for the purpose of this act.

Section 5. No funds under this act shall be awarded by the Department of Commerce after June 30, 1994. Any funds from this appropriation remaining unexpended or unencumbered on June 30, 1994, shall automatically lapse into the Sunny Day Fund.

Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

(2) For the purpose of making a loan to U.S. Bioscience, a company involved in the development and commercialization of new cancer treatments and allied diseases, to locate a pharmaceutical production facility in Chester or Montgomery County. U.S. Bioscience will invest at least \$50,000,000 into the project, which will create approximately 270 new jobs within three years of operation.....

(3) *For the purpose of making a loan to Blue Chips Products, Inc., a manufacturer/remanufacturer of automotive parts for the automotive aftermarket, for building acquisition and renovations to be made in connection with the consolidation/relocation of all of Blue Chip Products, Inc.’s, operations to Falls Township, Bucks County, and the introduction of new product lines. It is estimated that this project will result in the retention of 300 existing Pennsylvania jobs and the creation, within three years of operation, of 700 new jobs (400 jobs resulting from the Maryland*

<i>relocation and 300 jobs resulting from the new product lines)</i> .....	<b>\$3,000,000</b>
