CHAPTER LXXIII.

An ACT for the Relief of Peter Keplinger.

Section 1. **B**E it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be, and the same is hereby granted to Peter Keplinger, to be paid to him or his lawful attorney, immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of fifty dollars during his natural life, to be paid from the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and four, half yearly to him or his lawful attorney, not interested therein, on warrants drawn by the Governor on the state treasurer,

CHAPTER LXXIV.

An ACT to authorize the Select and Common Councils of the City of Philadelphia to erect Market-Houses in the said City.

Section 1. **BE** it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the first day of November next, it shall and may be lawful for the select and common councils of the city of Philadelphia, to cause a market-house or market-houses to be erected, at such place or places within the said city, as to them may appear most conducive to the interest and convenience of the citizens thereof, and others who may have occasion to use the same, and to make such regulations for the well-govern-
