AN ACT

For the relief of John Breitigam, a soldier of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to John Breitigam, of Berks county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled. "An act enabling a committee appointed by the court of common pleas of Westmoreland county, to sell and convey the real estate of Catharine Waldour, a lunatic."

Preamble.

WHEREAS, the real estate of the said lunatic, situate on the Allegheny river, in Pitt township, Allegheny county, containing three hundred and thirty-four acres, more or less, was sold and conveyed by the committee named in the act to which this is a supplement, and bonds

and mortgages taken to secure the payment of the purchase money: That the principal purchaser has failed, and is unable to pay, whereby the said lunatic is not sufficiently provided for and supported, nor is her estate in any way in that condition to render it as profitable and productive as it otherwise might be: That Casper Waldour, one of the committee, is now dead, and it is doubtful whether James Irwin, the survivor, has power under the act aforesaid, further to proceed in the premises:

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the said James Irwin be and he is hereby authorised to carry into execution, and by proceedings in his own name to enforce, all and every contract made by him and the late Casper Waldour, respecting the aforesaid tract of land; and, if necessary, to re-purchase the same at sheriff's sale, and to collect and receive for the use and benefit of the said Catharine Waldour and her heirs, all and every part of the unpaid purchase money, and for this purpose to sell and assign any and all mortgages which may have been taken upon the premises aforesaid, for such price as he can reasonably obtain for the same, without selling and re-purchasing said land, and in case he shall again be re-invested with the title, he is hereby authorised to sell and convey the tract of land or any part thereof, for the best price that can reasonably be obtained for the same: *Provided,* That the said James Irwin, before he proceeds to execute any of the powers hereby given to him, shall enter into such a recognizance as is prescribed in the act to which this is a supplement.

Proviso.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That after paying the debts due by the aforesaid Catharine Waldour, the said James Irwin may suffer the residue of the purchase money to remain upon interest, charged and secured on the premises, or shall place the same in some productive fund for her use, and after her death he shall render a true account of whatsoever he shall do touching the premises, to the legal heirs and representatives of the said Catharine Waldour, and shall pay over to the persons entitled by law to receive the same, the balance of the money remaining in his hands,

and be at all times and in all respects accountable as sole committee of the said Catharine Waldour.

AN ACT

Authorising the citizens of the town of Henrysburg, in the county of Centre, to levy tax on real property, for the purpose of keeping in repair the pipes conveying the water to said town.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Henrysburg, in the county of Centre, shall be and the same is hereby erected into a borough, to be comprised within the limits and boundaries of the original plot or draft of said town, for the purpose of enabling the citizens of said town to lay a tax on all real property within the limits aforesaid, to keep in repair the pipes which supply the said town with water, and for no other purpose whatever.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be lawful for all taxable inhabitants, who have resided in the said borough three months previously to such election, to meet at the school house, or at such other place in said town as may be agreed upon by a majority of the citizens, on the second Wednesday of April in every year, and there elect by ballot, between the hours of twelve and six o'clock of the same day, five respectable citizens residing therein, whose duty it shall be on petition to them for that purpose presented, signed by a majority of the citizens of said town, in each and every year, to assess, levy and collect, on all real property in said town, such amount of tax as may be neces-
