AN ACT

For the relief of John Warren, a soldier of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay John Warren, of Berks county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty.

AN ACT

To authorise James Hughes, Boyd Mercer and Joseph Harris, guardians of certain minor children therein mentioned, to sell and convey certain real estate.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall and may be lawful for James Hughes, the guardian of James, John, Aaron, Thomas, Louvina, Alexander, Nancy, Elizabeth and Lyle Moore, minor children of James Moore, late of Washington county, deceased, to make sale of one hundred and eighteen acres of land, more or less, situate in Cross-creek township, Washington county, adjoining lands of George

Campbell, Robert Marshal, the heirs of James Reed and James Palmer, and convey the estate of the said minors in the premises, by a good and sufficient deed of conveyance to the purchaser or purchasers, with the same effect as if the said James, John, Aaron, Thomas, Louvina, Alexander, Nancy, Elizabeth and Lyle Moore, had respectively attained the age of twenty-one years, and had duly executed such conveyance or conveyances, in their own proper persons: *Provided*, That before the said James Hughes shall make sale as aforesaid, he shall enter into recognizance with one or more sureties, before the orphans' court of Washington county, in such sum as the said court may direct, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duty, and the proper application of the money arising from said sale: *And provided also*, That no such sale shall be valid, until the terms thereof shall be approved of by said court.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That it shall and may be lawful for Boyd Mercer, the guardian of Joseph Leatherman, minor child of Doctor Joseph Leatherman, late of Washington county, deceased, to make sale of all the undivided interest of the said Joseph, in a tract of land situate in West Bethlehem township, Washington county, adjoining lands of John Dage, John Hosack and others, containing one hundred and ninety-seven acres, more or less, and convey the estate of the said minor in the premises, by good and sufficient deed or deeds of conveyance, to the purchaser or purchasers, with the same effect as if the said Joseph Leatherman had attained the age of twenty-one years, and had duly executed such conveyance or conveyances, in his own proper person: *Provided*, That before the said Boyd Mercer shall make sale as aforesaid, he shall enter into recognizance, with one or more sureties, before the orphans' court of Washington county, in such sum as said court may direct, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duty, and the proper application of the money arising from said sale: *And provided also*, That no such sale shall be valid, until the same shall have been approved of by said court.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That Joseph Harris, of Washington county, guardian of Isaac, Nicholas, Margaret and John Horn, minor children of Michael Horn, late of said county, deceased, is hereby authorised and empowered to sell at public or private sale, as may be most advantageous to the interest of said minors, all the right and title of the said Isaac, Nicholas, Margaret and John Horn, in and to a tract of land, situate in Amwell township, Washington county, containing one hundred and fifty-nine acres and eleven perches, and convey all the right and title of the said

minors in the premises, by good and sufficient deed or deeds of conveyance, to the purchaser or purchasers, with the same effect as if the said Isaac, Nicholas, Margaret and John had respectively attained the age of twenty-one years, and had duly executed such conveyance or conveyances in their own proper person or persons: *Provided*, That before the said Joseph Harris shall make sale as aforesaid, he shall enter into recognizance, with two or more sureties, before the orphans' court of Washington county, in such sum as said court may direct, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duty and the proper application of the money arising from said sale: *And provided also*, That no such sale of said real estate shall be valid until the said court shall have approved thereof.

AN ACT

To relinquish the purchase money and interest due the commonwealth, on a certain piece of land in Berks county, to the Hill Church.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the purchase money and interest due to the commonwealth on a certain piece of land, situate in Pike township, in the county of Berks, containing fifty acres and seventy-four perches, and the usual allowance of six per cent. surveyed on a warrant dated the twelfth day of August, Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and forty-seven, granted to Casper Grygher, George Ernest and Andrew Rodenheffer, and returned for the
