AN ACT

Authorising loans from certain banks.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the several banks of this commonwealth be and they are hereby required to loan to the commonwealth, the amount prescribed by the several acts of assembly, regulating the same, and the Governor be and he is hereby authorised and required to give notice to said banks, and negotiate said loans, upon the terms contained in said acts, and that the Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorised to issue certificates of stock to said banks, for the amount thus loaned, upon the terms stipulated in the acts regulating said banks, and the amount thus loaned to be paid to and vested in the com-

missioners of the internal improvement fund, to be applied by them to canal and rail-road purposes.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled “An act to encourage the destruction of foxes and wild cats.”

Certain provision of former act extended to Bradford.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the provision of the act passed the third day of March, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, entitled “An act to encourage the destruction of foxes and wild cats,” be extended to the county of Bradford, as far as it relates to wild cats.

To Huntingdon, Indiana and Mercer.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the provisions of the act passed the third day of March, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, entitled “An act to encourage the destruction of foxes and wild cats,” be extended to the counties of Huntingdon, Indiana and Mercer.
