## AN ACT

For the relief of Jacob Shrite, a soldier of the revolution, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Jacob Shrite, of Dauphin county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty.

Gratuity and annuity to J. Shrite.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid;* That so much of the second section of an act entitled "An act for the relief of sundry soldiers of the revolutionary war," passed the twenty-third April, eighteen hundred and twenty-nine, as authorises Michael Doudel to receive the amount for the use of John Datamar, of the borough of York, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the said annuity shall be paid to the said John Datamar, or his order, according to the provisions of said section.

J. Datamar of York to receive his own annuity.
