AN ACT

Sanctioning the loan of one hundred and six thousand dollars, made by the Pennsylvania and Philadelphia Banks and Columbia Bridge Company, for canal and rail-road purposes.

WHEREAS, The banks of Pennsylvania and Philadelphia and the Columbia Bridge Company, on the recommendation of the canal commissioners, advanced to the commonwealth the sum of one hundred and six thousand dollars, for canal and rail-road purposes: And whereas, the accounts of the expenditure of said money cannot be settled until the same is recognized as a loan:

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of one hundred and six thousand dollars, advanced to the commonwealth for canal and rail-road purposes, by the banks of Pennsylvania and Philadelphia, and the Columbia Bridge Company, be and the same is hereby recognized as a temporary loan, and the accounts of the expenditure of the same shall be settled in the same manner as other accounts are directed to be

settled, and the said sum shall be repaid, with interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, out of any future permanent loan that may be authorised for canal and rail-road purposes.

AN ACT

Declaring Little Mahoning creek and Spring creek public highways.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, Little Mahoning creek, in Indiana county, from the mouth to the north fork, and Spring creek, in Warren county, from its mouth to a point where the road leading from Franklin, through Warren county, in a direction to Chatauque lake, crosses the same, be and the same are hereby declared public highways, for the passage of rafts, boats, or other craft; and it shall and may be lawful for the inhabitants desirous of using the navigation of said creeks, to remove all natural and artificial obstructions from the bed or channel of the same, except dams for mills and other water works; and also to erect such slopes at the mills or other dams in said creeks, as may be necessary for the passage of rafts, boats, or other vessels: *Provided,* Such slopes be so constructed as not to injure the works of such dams: *And provided also,* That any person or persons owning or possessing lands on said creeks, shall have liberty to construct any dam or dams across the same, agreeably and subject to all the
