the eighth and ninth sections of the act to which this is a further supplement: *And provided*, That the president and managers of said company shall, within three months after the completion of said road, make a return to the prothonotary of the county of Schuylkill, to be by him filed on record in his office, for the inspection of all those concerned, under oath or affirmation of the president and secretary, of the actual cost of the said rail-road and amount of damages paid to individuals through whose lands the said road may pass.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the company shall not prevent any person or persons, being the owner or owners of land bordering on the said rail-road, or adjacent thereto, from making such lateral rail-roads and to connect them with said rail-road, from their said lands, as the said person or persons may conceive necessary for the purpose of transporting their coal or produce down or up the said rail-road: *Provided*, That when any such lateral roads may be made, they shall be so constructed as not to do any injury to the main rail-road.

### A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An act affording immediate relief to Michael Mullen, and granting him an annuity," passed the sixth day of February, eighteen hundred and ten.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the authority and trust given to Fullerton Woods, his executors or attorney, by the act to which this is a

further supplement, and the authority and trust given to John Denniston, his executors or attorney, by a supplement thereto, passed the second day of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-one, to receive and pay over the annuity of Michael Mullen, is hereby declared null and void; and Robert Nixon, of the borough of Indiana, is hereby substituted, to whom the said annuity shall be paid, or to his executors or his or their lawful attorney, to be expended and accounted for in the same manner as is provided in the act to which this is a further supplement; and if at any time the said Robert Nixon, or his executors or their lawful attorney, shall misuse or abuse the said trust, or neglect to perform the same, it shall and may be lawful for the orphans' court of Indiana county, to vacate his or their appointment, and substitute such other trustee or trustees as shall faithfully perform the trust aforesaid.

AN ACT

For the relief of John King.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the act entitled "An act for the relief of insolvent debtors," passed the sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and the several supplements thereto, with all their provisions, be and they are hereby extended to the case of John King, late of Straban township, Adams county, as fully and effectually to all
