## No. 37.

### A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An act to incorporate the owners and occupiers of the Wicacoa and Moyamensing meadows, in the county of Philadelphia, for the sole purpose of keeping the banks, dams, sluices and flood-gates in repair, and to raise a fund to defray the expenses thereof," passed twelfth April, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,*

That the election provided for, in the third section of the act to which this is a supplement, shall be held on the first Monday in March yearly, and that so much of the said act as is inconsistent herewith, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be competent for the trustees, directors or managers of any corporation heretofore or hereafter established by the laws of this commonwealth, or for the stockholders therein, at their general meetings, to alter the times and places fixed by law for the meeting of said trustees, managers, directors or stockholders, full notice of such intended alteration having been given at a

previous meeting of said trustees, directors, managers or stockholders: *Provided*, That no such alteration shall be made in the time of meeting of said trustees, managers or directors, but with the consent of two-thirds of their number, or in the time of meeting of the said stockholders, but with the consent of two-thirds of their number, convened at a general meeting.

## No. 38.

### AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers, and Mary Magdalen Nicholas, widow of a soldier of the revolution.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to William Iddings, of Beaver county, and to Peter Schnull, of Montgomery county, soldiers of the revolution, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty.

§40 gratuity and annuity granted to W. Iddings & P. Schnull.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to Mary Magdalen Nicholas, of Philadelphia county, widow of Henry Nicholas, a soldier of the revolution, or to her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life,
