AN ACT

For the relief of sundry soldiers, and Mary Magdalen Nicholas, widow of a soldier of the revolution.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to William Iddings, of Beaver county, and to Peter Schnull, of Montgomery county, soldiers of the revolution, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty. \$40 gratuity

AN ACT

To establish an academy in the town of Dundaff, in the county of Susquehanna, and for other purposes.

Academy es-
tablished.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania in general assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That there shall be and hereby is established in the town of Dundaff, in the county of Susquehanna, an academy or public school, for the education of youth in the useful arts, sciences and literature, by the name, style and title of the "Dundaff Academy."
